

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, August 31, 1938 at 2:00 P.M.

Seth A. Hubbard, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on August 10, 1938 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Mr. Wolfe, representative of W.P.A. addressed the Board and inquired whether or not the Board intended to submit applications for new projects. He stated that the Relief Rolls will increase considerably during the winter months and if anything is to be done, he urged the Board to do it as soon as possible as it takes at least two months before a project can be approved and work started.

The need for a Town Highway barn was discussed by the Board and the Supt. of Highways. It was the consensus of opinion that if the barn could be built by W.P.A. it would not only be a great saving to the Town, but also create more work for the unemployed. The matter was referred to the Highway Committee.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that John M. Burgess be and he hereby is appointed special policeman for the Town of Riverhead, to serve on school duty at the Riverhead High School on Pulaski St., Village and Town of Riverhead, and it is further

Resolved that the said special Policeman serve at the pleasure of the Town Board between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M., 11:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. and 3:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M., under the direction and supervision of the Town Board of Riverhead; and it is further

Resolved that his compensation be fixed at the rate of fifty cents per hour. The Vote, Justices Zaleski, Kelly, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Homan, Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The matter of patrolling the summer cottages during the winter months was discussed by the Board and on motion and vote was referred to the Police Committee, with power to act.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Supt. of Highways be authorized to expend the sum not to exceed \$200. on the MacDonald property to be used as a parking site, providing however, that the agreement between the merchants and the executors of the property is duly executed. The Vote,

Justices Zaleski, Kelly, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Homan, Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Board of Supervisors enclosing a resolution fixing Monday, November 28, 1938 as the date of the meeting at which the taxes for the next fiscal year will be levied. The Communication and resolution was ordered placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the bills for the month of August 1938.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, Sept. 14, 1938 at 2:00 P.M.
