

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, July 13, 1938 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on June 29, 1938 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from Mr. Joseph A. Romanski of South Jamesport making application to serve as a Process Server for the Town of Riverhead. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Matthew Bender & Company in regard to the 1937 edition of Gilberts Penal Law and Criminal Code supposed to have been sent to the Police of the Town of Riverhead on July 13, 1937 by parcel post. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Justice Warner reporting on the matter of acquiring the property in the rear of the business places on the south side of East Main St. for a parking area advised the Board that there are so many obstacles to overcome in obtaining this property at the present time that it is the recommendation of the Committee that the matter be laid on the table for the time being or until such time when the proposition can be worked up to better advantage or another suitable area is available but at present there is nothing more that the Committee could do. He stated however that he was willing to continue with the Committee to work for a solution of the parking problem if the Board so desired.

The Parking Committee was continued in force and was also directed to study the Town Parking Ordinance to make recommendations if any changes are deemed necessary.

Mr. George Cushman of the Rotary Committee thanked the Board and the Town Committee for their efforts, stating that he understands the situation and that they are satisfied for the time being, however the Rotary Committee would like to contact the Town Committee from time to time to assist them if possible in relieving the Parking situation.

Mr. Herman Aldrich of the Rotary Committee also thanked the Board for their efforts and again urged them to continue trying to relieve the parking congestion in the Town and suggested that possibly a change in the Parking Ordinance may help.

Mr. J. Leo Saxstien, Attorney, addressed the Board stating that he thought the Parking Committee should be continued and suggested that the time limit for parking be extended over a larger portion of the roads.

Justice Zaleski favored a change of the time limit for parking especially on Saturday nights. He considered that it would alleviate conditions considerably.

Supervisor Homan submitted his report for the month of June 1938 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Justice Zaleski advised the Board that he has had many people speak to him in regard to bath houses at the Howell M. Reeve Beach complaining that there is no place to undress and that they object to people disrobing in cars and places unseemly. The matter was deferred for future consideration.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on July 27, 1938 at 2:00 P.M.
