

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, June 23, 1937 at 9:00 A. M.

Roger M. Wiley, Town Attorney and William H. Clark, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on June 9, 1937 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Mr. Clifferd Raynor and Mr. Howard Downsof South Jamesport addressed the Board and presented a petition signed by 69 residents of that vicinity requesting the Board to appoint a special Policeman for South Jamesport during the summer months for the welfare and protection of the community. The petition was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that Frank Rascinewski be and he hereby is appointed Special Policeman to serve at the pleasure of the Board at South Jamesport from June 23, 1937 and up to and including Labor Day under the direction and supervision of Thomas J. Walker, Special Policeman in Charge, salary at the rate of \$3.60 per day, and further

RESOLVED that Bruno Haupt be and he hereby is appointed Special Policeman to assist at South Jamesport without compensation, and be it further

RESOLVED that Frank Yakaboski be and he hereby is appointed Special Policeman to serve at the pleasure of the Board from June 23, 1937 and up to and including Labor Day under the direction and supervision of the Special Policeman in Charge, salary at the rate of \$3.60 per day. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

An affidavit from the Town Clerk stating that no petition was filed for a referendum upon the matter of the appointment of a zoning Commission was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

A communication from Mrs. H. Cohen together with a bill in the amount of \$73.85 for damages to her car, said to have been caused by skidding on a freshly oiled road at Manorville was submitted. Supt. of Highways Clark explained the situation to the Board and the matter was referred to the Town Attorney.

A communication from Attorney George W. Hildreth addressed to the Supt. of Highways and also a communication from Mr. George B. Ingram in regard to Willow Street, South Jamesport was read and referred to the Town Attorney.

Town Attorney Roger M. Wiley submitted ordinances regulating the use of the Town Docks of the Town of Riverhead for the consideration of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that the following ordinance relating to the use of the Town Docks of the Town of Riverhead, be and the same is hereby adopted, subject to permissive referendum.

WHEREAS, the Town of Riverhead has recently built a new dock along the Peconic River adjoining the public parking space and has repaired and put in order the old Town Dock at the foot of McDermott Avenue in said Town of Riverhead.

NOW THEREFORE, in order to promote the health, safety and general welfare of the people of the Town of Riverhead and the protection and preservation of the property of said Town and of its inhabitants and to preserve peace and good order in said Town and the benefit of trade therein, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead does hereby, pursuant to Section 130 of the Town Law, enact the following ordinance regulating the use of said two Town Docks.

1. No portion of said docks shall be used at any time for any purpose other than the receiving and discharging of passengers and freight.
2. No person shall use any portion of said Town Docks for the purpose set forth in Paragraph 1, for a longer period than three hours out of every twenty-four hours; said period of twenty-four hours beginning at 6:00 A.M., Eastern Standard Time, each day.
3. A violation of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not exceeding Ten (\$10.00) Dollars for the first offense and by a fine of not exceeding Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars for each subsequent offense.

4. Any and all prior resolutions or ordinances regulating the use of either of said docks are hereby repealed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead, be and he hereby is directed to post a sign on each of said docks advising the public of the provisions of this ordinance. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Park Committee reporting on the matter of a Life Guard at the Pier Avenue Beach recommended that a Life Guard be provided at said Beach during the Red Cross Swimming School.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Warner it was RESOLVED that Horace Corwin be and he hereby is appointed a Life Guard at the Pier Avenue Beach from June 28th to July 17th, 1937 inclusive, to act in cooperation with the Red Cross Chapter, salary at the rate of \$20.00 per week. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Park Committee reporting on the matter of an assistant Life Guard at the Beach in Howell M. Reeve Park recommended that as there was no money provided in the budget this year, the matter be deferred for consideration in the next years budget.

The matter of Life lines at the Beach at Howell M. Reeve Park was discussed.


On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED that the matter of purchasing life lines for Howell M. Reeve Park be left to the discretion of the Park Committee. The resolution was carried by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A complaint in regard to the Good Humor trucks parked on certain highways of the Town was brought to the attention of the Board by Supervisor Burns. The matter was referred to the Town Attorney and ordered placed on the calendar for the next Town Board meeting.

The matter of the dangerous condition at the end of Roanoke Avenue leading to Roanoke Landing was discussed by the Board and referred to the Highway Committee to place proper caution signs.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the bills for the month of June, 1937.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, July 14, 1937 at 9:00 A. M.
