

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, October 13, 1937 at 9:00 A. M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on Wednesday, October 6, 1937 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A delegation of taxpayers from Aquebogue attended the meeting for the purpose of ascertaining the status of the sidewalk project at Aquebogue.

A communication from W.P.A. to Supervisor Burns stating that the above sidewalk project was approved in Washington on September 4th, 1937 but that the project has not scheduled for immediate operation due to the very small number of employable persons on our relief rolls. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Mr. Harry Saxstien addressed the Board and asked how many employable persons were on the relief rolls and was informed that there were three at present. He also inquired whether or not the Town could place the Sidewalks in the Budget and build them without P. W. A.

Mr. Harry Corwin addressed the Board and urged that the sidewalk project be started as soon as possible as the people of Aquebogue are anxious that they be laid.

A communication was read from County Treasurer John G. Peck in regard to the satisfaction of the Tax Receiver's Bond for the Town of Riverhead.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED that there is no objection on the part of the Town of Riverhead of the satisfaction of the Tax Receiver's Bond for 1936-1937 provided the audit by the County Treasurer shows no objection thereto. The resolution was carried by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from the Honorable Robert L. Bacon, acknowledging receipt of a resolution by the Town Board of Riverhead, urging that the western end of the Peconic River Project be Federalized for maintenance purposes. The communication was ordered placed on file.

The matter in regard to the continuous blocking of the driveway in front of the property of Mr. Jahn R. Terell, Second Street was brought to the attention of the Board. The matter was referred to the Superintendent of Highways and the Special Policeman in Charge.
