

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, January 29, 1936 at 9:00 A.M.

Roger M. Wiley, Town Attorney and William H. Clark, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on January 8, 1936 and minutes of a Special Meeting of the Town Board held on Saturday, January 18, 1936 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from J. Leo Saxstien, Attorney, in regard to the dismissal of Ralph W. Gallagher former Clerk to the Police Department. The communication was referred to the Town Attorney.

A communication was read from J. H. Hildreth, Superintendent of Marine Fisheries in regard to the area in Reeves Bay and Flanders Bay which has been condemned by the Conservation Department and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the State Department of Health in regard to Reeves and Western Peconic Bays and was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from C. W. Ludlam in regard to the parking of cars in front of the driveway leading into the property of the Garden Restaurant. The matter was referred to the Highway Committee for investigation.

A communication was read from Mr. George W. Hildreth, Commodore of the Riverhead Yacht Club in regard to the four channel lights to be installed in the Peconic River and Bay. The matter was referred to a Committee composed of Justices Boutcher and Luce.

A communication from Harry G. Penny, Secretary and Treasurer of the Riverhead Fire Department, inclosing the Annual Report of the Treasurer for the year ending December 31, 1935, pursuant to Section 181 of the Town Law, was read and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Association of Towns notifying the Board that the Fourth Annual Meeting of the Association will be held in Albany, N. Y., on February 26th and 27th, 1936 and that Riverhead Town is entitled to one vote. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Mr. Walter F. Barnes, President of the Suffolk County Historical Society in regard to the \$150.00 which was paid them by the Town.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to pay the sum of \$150.00 to the Suffolk County Historical Society, pursuant to a resolution which was duly adopted at the last bi-ennial town election. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Bond No. F105291 of the American Employers' Insurance Company bonding George W. Cooper as Special Policeman to serve civil processes in the amount of \$500.00 was presented to the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that bond No. F105291 of the American Employers' Insurance Company bonding, George W. Cooper as Special Policeman to serve civil processes in the amount of \$500.00 be and the same hereby is approved as to form, manner of execution and sufficiency of the surety and be it further

RESOLVED that the Town Clerk be and he hereby is directed to file said bond with the County Clerk pursuant to law.

Supervisor Milton L. Burns presented his Annual Report for the year 1935 to the Board.

On motion made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Warner it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor's Annual Report for the year 1935 be published in the official newspaper pursuant to law. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes, Total vote, Yes, 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The matter of uniforms for the members of the Police Department was brought to the attention of the Board and on motion and vote was referred to the Police Committee.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher it was RESOLVED that on the order of the Superintendent of Highways the Supervisor be authorized to pay to John Skinkaytis the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED (700.00) DOLLARS upon delivery to the Town Attorney of a proper deed conveying to the Town of Riverhead free of encumbrance the fee to such of his land as lies with Greene Street at Jamesport, such payment to be made only upon approval of title by the Town Attorney, and be it further

RESOLVED that on the order of the Superintendent of Highways the Supervisor be authorized to pay to Adam Schelansky the sum of THREE HUNDRED (300.00) DOLLARS upon delivery to the Town Attorney of a proper deed conveying to the Town of Riverhead free of all encumbrance the land on the North side of Second Street, Riverhead, owned by him and shown upon a survey by H. Young required for the widening of Second Street, such payment to be

made only on the removal of the hedge now existing to a point so as not to encroach upon Second Street as widened, and after approval of Title by the Town Attorney. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes, 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.


Justices Boutcher and Kelly, Highway Committee reported that the road drain through the land leased by John F. Danielowich, Deephole Road, Calverton was necessary and that the bill for damages to said property in the amount of \$25.00 be paid.

On motion made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Warner it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay to John F. Danielowich the sum of \$25.00 for damages caused by a road drain through land leased by him on Deephole Road, Calverton. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The matter in regard to the slip at the Town Dock which is part of McDermott Avenue was brought to the attention of the Board and was referred to the Highway Committee for investigation and report.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town bills for the month of January.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned until February 11, 1936 at 9:00 A. M.
