

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, February 27, 1935 at 10:00 A. M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on February 13, 1935 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication from The Riverhead Fire Department opposing the semi-annual payment of Taxes was read and ordered placed on file.

Justices Rubenstein and Luce, a committee on the petition for two street lamps on Sweezy Avenue between Parkway Street and Osborne Avenue, recommended that one light be placed in that vicinity.

On motion of Justice Hallock seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was RESOLVED that the Town Clerk be and he is hereby authorized to direct the Long Island Lighting Company to place one 80 C. P. lamp on Sweezy Avenue between Parkway Street and Osborne Avenue. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Hallock it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay the Suffolk County Historical Society, the sum of \$125.00, heretofore voted by the citizens of the Town of Riverhead, money already having been placed in the Budget for the year 1935. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supervisor Burns presented his report for the month of January, 1935 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Town Attorney Smith was present at 10:40 A. M.

Notice from the Department of Labor, Division of Workmen's Compensation that the award to the claimant Charles H. Case for disability 2½ weeks compensation at \$12.82 per week, total \$32.05 covering the period from November 2, 1934 to November 20, 1934 was presented to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes addressed the Board, stating that he has discontinued his extra clerk and requested that the three weeks salary due her be paid.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED, by unanimous consent that Louise E. Downs be paid the amount of \$75.00, representing three weeks salary from February 5, 1935 to February 26, 1935.

On motion and vote the meeting adjourned at 12:15 noon to convene at 1:00 P. M.

The Town Board reconvened at 1:00 P. M.

Town Attorney Smith was present.

A bill from Dominick Poliwada, Cavlerton, N. Y. for damages done by scraping his land with snow plows to make a road for public use, was presented to the Board and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole, and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that Bond #982529 of the American Surety Company, bonding Julian Rubenstein, Justice of the Peace, in the amount of One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars be and the same is hereby approved as to form, manner of execution and the sufficiency of the surety, the same being additional surety, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and he is hereby directed to file same with the County Clerk.

The matter of the drain through the property of Danielowich Brothers was brought to the attention of the Board and referred to a Committee composed of Justices Luce and Hallock for investigation.

On motion duly made by Justice Hallock and seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was RESOLVED that John H. Leonard, Special Policeman be constituted the person to execute and serve civil processes, the Justices Courts, to serve at the pleasure of the Board at a salary of \$20.00 per month. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. The total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Rubenstein it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the continuation certificate, continuing Bond #23532, bonding John H. Leonard, Special Policeman in the amount of \$500.00 be and the same is hereby approved as to form, manner of execution and the sufficiency of the surety, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is hereby directed to file same with the County Clerk.

William H. Clark, Supt. of Highways presented his determination and agreement pursuant to Section 105 of the Highway Law which was approved and signed by the members of the Town Board.

The Town Board then convened as Board of Audit and examined the Town bills for the month of February, 1935.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned till Wednesday March 13, 1935 at 10:00 A. M.
