

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, April 24, 1935 at 10:00 A.M.

Supt. of Highways Clark and Town Attorney Smith were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on April 10, 1935 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from Mrs J. Irving Edwards thanking the Board for their expression of sympathy. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Proof of publication of the Supervisor's report for the year 1934 from the County Review was presented to the Board and ordered placed on file.

A petition signed by several residents of the Riverhead Lighting District requesting street lights from the last light on West Main Street to the corner of Mill Road was presented to the Board and on motion and vote was referred to a Committee composed of Justices Luce and Rubenstein for investigation.

The applications of Mrs Bessie Fox and Mrs Lester Crowley for the concessions at the Howell M. Reeve Memorial Park for the ensuing year were brought to the attention of the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Hallock and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED that a public hearing be held to consider the matter on the 8th day of May, 1935 at ten o'clock in the forenoon (Daylight Saving Time) pursuant to subdivision 7, of Section 64 of the Town Law and further

RESOLVED that the Town Clerk be and he hereby is directed to publish said notice in the official newspaper pursuant to law. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous consent of the Board.

The matter of the appropriation of \$50.00 to the G. A. R. for Memorial Day exercises was brought to the attention of the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Rubenstein it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to pay the sum not to exceed \$50.00, formerly appropriated, in such a manner as he deems wise pursuant to Subdivision 12 of Section 64 of the Town Law provided however that no demand is made by the Commander of the American Legion and the Commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes,

Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was deemed duly adopted.

The matter of dangerous intersections of highways throughout the Town was discussed by the Board, and by unanimous consent a Committee composed of Justices Stackpole and Hallock was appointed to investigate the matter and make recommendations as to the placing of traffic signs.

On motion duly made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Rubenstein it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that this Board recommends that the trees on the Southwest corner of Pulaski Street and Maynor Avenue be removed by the Superintendent of Highways.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town Bills for the month of April.

The Town Board recessed at 12:15 noon to reconvene at 3:00 P. M.
