

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of River-  
head held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, June 12, 1935 at 10:00 A. M.

were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on May 29, 1935  
were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication from the Department of Audit & Control acknow-  
ledging receipt of a resolution of the Town Board relating to the services  
of the State Examiners was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from Mr. George Cushman of the Long Island  
Produce and Fertilizer Company in regard to additional protection at the  
railroad crossings at Marcy and Sweezy Avenues was read.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by  
Justice Luce it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor and Town Attorney be direct-  
ed to investigate the matter of the Railroad crossings at Marcy and Sweezy  
avenues in conjunction with information from the Long Island Produce and  
Fertilizer Company and if necessary the Supervisor use his authority as a  
county official to further this protection at the above named crossings.  
The resolution was carried by the unanimous consent of the Board.

The Supervisor's report for the month of May, 1935 was present-  
ed to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on  
file.

The matter of straightening the line between the properties  
of Mr. Danald Easton and the Howell M. Reeve Park was discussed by the Board.

On motion made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice  
Hallock it was RESOLVED that a letter be sent to Mr. Donald Easton advising  
him that the Town Board does not wish to make any changes in the boundary  
lines of Howell M. Reeve Park at this time. The vote, Justice Stackpole,  
Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote Yes 5,  
No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The petition for street lights on West Main Street was dis-  
cussed by the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by  
Justice Luce it was RESOLVED that the Clerk be and he is hereby authorized  
and directed to order the Long Island Lighting Company to place three 80 C. P.  
lamps on West Main Street from the last light on said West Main Street to  
Mill Road and charge to the Account of the Riverhead Lighting District. The  
vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns,  
Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly  
adopted.

The matter of the report of the Department of Audit and Control is discussed by the Board.

The Town Attorney advised the board that it is illegal to contribute money to any public institution even though it had been voted by the people. He also advised the Board that it is illegal to pay interest on certificates of indebtedness of the Riverhead Water District from the General Town Fund.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to transfer the amount of interest paid on Certificates of Indebtedness of the Riverhead Water District in the year 1933, from the Riverhead Water District Operating Account to the General Town Fund.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Hallock it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Town Clerk be and he hereby is authorized and directed to transfer excess money for marriage licenses issued but never consummated, to the Supervisor to be held in a suspense account pending an opinion from the Town Attorney.

Justice Luce offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Hallock

WHEREAS this Town Board did on the 16th day of January, 1935 adopt the following resolution: "RESOLVED that the rate for traveling expenses for the Board of Assessors be and it is hereby fixed at the rate of \$1.00 per hour".

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the above mentioned resolution be and it hereby is repealed and rescinded. The above resolution was carried by the unanimous consent of the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Stackpole it was RESOLVED that the rate for car hire be and it hereby is fixed at the rate of six cents (\$.06) per mile pursuant to Chapter 465 of the Laws of the State of New York, 1935, and pursuant to the report of the Department of Audit and Control. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The matter of files and fire resisting equipment for the Assessors office, as recommended by the Dept. of Audit and Control was discussed by the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED that the Assessors Clerk be and he hereby is authorized to purchase, files and fire resisting equipment necessary for the Assessors office, the amount not to exceed \$100.00, amount to be paid out of the Town Surplus Account. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. L. C. Austin, President of the Civic Club of Riverhead addressed the Board requesting them to recommend to the War Department that a wider yacht basin at Peconic Avenue be included in their plans and specifications for the dredging of Peconic River.

On motion duly made by Justice Hallock and seconded by Justice Rubenstein it was RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead respectfully request the Department of War of the United States of America to include in their plans and specifications for the dredging of the Peconic River, the construction of a yacht basin on the easterly side of Peconic Avenue between the Towns of Riverhead and Southampton, of sufficient size to enable pleasure and commercial craft to turn around and proceed in the opposite direction. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes, Total vote, Yes, 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supt. of Highways Clark advised the Board that he had given a permit to the United States Government to tear up and lay a new sidewalk in front of the new Post Office property on Second Street.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Stackpole it was RESOLVED that this Board approve the above action taken by the Supt. of Highways pursuant to Section 61 of the Highway Law. The vote, Justice Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board recessed at 12:15 noon to reconvene at 1:15 P. M.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce it was Resolved that the Supervisor be and he hereby is directed and authorized to pay to the New York State Employees' Retirement System, contributions to the funds of the Retirement System, for fiscal years ending June 30, 1932 and June 30, 1933, as bill rendered in the amount of \$1,686.63, and further

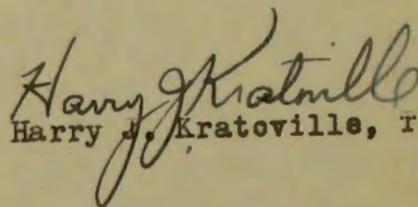
RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to transfer \$1,686.63 from the Town Surplus Account to the General Town Account. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion duly made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Stackpole it was RESOLVED that this Board recommends that the Executive Committee of the T. E. R. A. in the County of Suffolk be enlarged, and it is the sense of this meeting that the Committee should constitute a representative from each Township. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous consent of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills for the month of May.

On motion made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Hallock it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to pay the Welfare bills for the month of May, 1935 as approved by the Town Welfare Officer.

On motion duly made by Justice Hallock and seconded by Justice Rubenstein it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the meeting adjourn till Wednesday, June 26, 1935 at 9:00 A. M.
