

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, August 28, 1935 at 9:00 A.M.

Town Attorney Smith and Supt. of Highways Clark were present.

A communication from Dr. C. Sherwood Hallett requesting "No Parking" signs in front of his house was read. On motion and vote the Town Clerk was directed to acknowledge the letter, stating that the matter will be considered when the Board revises the parking ordinances. The letter was ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Department of Taxation and Finance in regard to Tax evasion by government employees was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Grand Central Cadillac Renting Corporation, commending the Police Department of the Town of Riverhead for the very courteous and efficient service rendered upon the occasion of a serious accident to one of their cars on Route #25 in Calverton on July 20, 1935. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Hallock and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Special Policemen in Charge have warning cards printed, similar to summonses for the purpose of warning strangers of the violation of the parking regulations of the Town.

On motion made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Stackpole it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Police Department be notified to stop all cars with one light and give warning of the violation of Section 15 Sub. 2 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law and keep a record of the number of the offenders.

Justices Hallock and Luce, Committee on the free parking signs reported that the signs have been ordered and in due time they will be properly placed.

The Committee upon the matter of a complaint of John Doefler in regard to the repair of a private road in Calverton, reported that due to the fact that heavy rains are continually washing dirt from said road over River Road a main thoroughfare, thereby causing a hazard to traffic, the matter of repairs to the said road should be left to the discretion of the Supt. of Highways.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town bills for the month of August, 1935.

There being no further business on motion made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the meeting adjourn till Wednesday, Sept. 11, 1935 at 9:00 A. M.
