

The minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held April 10, 1934 at 10 A. M.

Town Attorney Smith and Superintendent of Highways Clark were present.

The minutes of a meeting held March 27, 1934 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

Communication was read from George F. Kenneth, Suburban Real Estate, regarding the conditions that prevail on the beach at the foot of Park Avenue during the bathing season, and ordered placed on file.

Communication was read from Riverhead Fire District in regard to obtaining a contract for rental of hydrants and water supply for the year of 1935 or as many years up to five as can be obtained.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, for the benefit of Riverhead Water District, sell sufficient water and rent the fire hydrants within said Water District, to Riverhead Fire District for the year 1935, for the sum of \$1800, and the Town Clerk is hereby authorized to execute, in the name of the Town Board a contract to that effect. The vote, Justices Burnside, Stackpole, Luce and Rubenstein, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total votes, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

Communication was read from Z. R. Hallock requesting the renewal of permit issued to him last season for the operating of a stand at Pier Avenue near the Sound for the purpose of selling refreshments etc. The matter was referred to Town Attorney Smith for an opinion.

Communication was read from Jas. H. Matthews & Co., in regard to two bronze plates for the concrete pillars on either side of the entrance to Howell M. Reeve Park. The communication was referred to Superintendent of Highways Clark.

The matter of having the water plant building painted was brought to the attention of the Board. Sealed bids for the work were opened as follows:- A. Holeston--\$190.00, Conklin and Sowinski--\$130.00, and W. R. Hooper--\$236.50.

On motion duly made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was RESOLVED that the Town Board accept the bid of George H. Conklin and Walter Sowinski in the amount of \$130.00 to paint the Riverhead Water Works Building according to specifications. The vote, Justices Burnside, Stackpole, Luce and Rubenstein, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total votes, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

On motion duly made by Justice Burnside and seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was RESOLVED that the Town Board accept the tract of land dedicated by William J. Kratoville, and others, to the Town for a highway which tract extends from East Main Street to Hubbard Avenue and which is to be known as Fairway Avenue, in accordance with the approval of the Town Attorney Smith pursuant to a resolution passed December 13, 1933. The vote, Justices Burnside, Stackpole, Luce and Rubenstein, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.


On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to engage John Schmitt, Certified Public Accountant, for the purpose of continuing and completing a thorough examination of the Town accounts including those of the Receiver of Taxes, in accordance with an opinion from the Town Attorney, and to find out the cost of same. The vote, Justices Burnside, Stackpole, Luce and Rubenstein, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Burnside, it was RESOLVED that the Superintendent of Highways, William Clark, be and he hereby is authorized to negotiate the sale of a large caterpillar tractor which is of no use to the Town for the sum of \$100.00. The vote, Justices Burnside, Stackpole, Luce and Rubenstein, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

The Town Board recessed at 12 O'clock noon to convene at 1:00 P. M.

The Town Board reconvened at 2:00 P. M. for the purpose of hearing in the matter of the proposed Saw-Mill Brook Road, pursuant to Section 90 of the Railroad Law. Joseph M. Nicholeson, Assistant Engineer, and William A. Colton, Attorney, represented the Railroad. Jacob Harding, Attorney, represented the Town of Riverhead. After hearing the testimony in this matter, William A. Colton, Attorney for the Railroad moved that the Town Board deny their application to lay out said proposed Saw-Mill Brook Road as the testimony did not show a necessity for such a Road. The Town Board reserved decision.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the Board adjourned until May 1st, 1934 at 10:00 A. M.
