

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of
Riverhead, held at the Town Hall, May 1, 1934.

Town Attorney Smith and Superintendent of Highways Clark
were present.

The minutes of a meeting held April 10, 1934 were read and
a motion and vote duly adopted.

Communication was read from the Long Island Chamber of
Commerce regarding the improvement of water ways, authorizing Towns in
the County of Suffolk to borrow money and issue certificates of indebtedness
therefor.

On motion duly made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice
Stackpole, it was RESOLVED, by unanimous consent, that the above commu-
nication be laid on the table.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by
Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED that the uniforms to be worn by the Special
Policemen shall be the type similar to the Smith-Grey uniforms Model B1P,
and that the Special Policemen be authorized to make arrangements for the
purchase of same. The vote, Justices Stackpole and Luce, Yes, Supervisor
Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared
duly carried.

Communication was read from Dr. A. E. Payne, regarding
John Daniewlowich, injury caused by a hole left in the road, with
enclosed bill for \$25.00.

On advise of Town Attorney Smith, the above communication
was referred to Superintendent of Highways Clark for investigation.

An agreement was read between William H. Clark, Superinten-
dent of Highways and Mrs Elizabeth Morell in regard to maintenance of a
drain through her property.

On motion duly made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice
Stackpole, it was RESOLVED that the Town Board approve the agreement and
that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay Mrs Elizabeth
Morell, from the General Town Fund the sum of \$75.00. The vote, Justices
Stackpole, and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 0.
The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

A communication was read from the Riverhead Fire District
accepting the offer of the Riverhead Water District to sell water and rent
fire hydrants for the sum of \$1800, for the year 1935, and ordered placed
in file.

A communication was read from the Riverhead Woman's Club in regard to the upkeep of the trash cans used in the Village. The communication was referred to the Superintendent of Highways.

The matter of renewing the permit issued to Z. R. Hallock to operate stand at Pier Avenue and the Sound was discussed and the matter was referred to Superintendent of Highways Clark.

Superintendent of Highways Clark presented his determination and agreement for the expenditure of Highway moneys during the year 1934. The determination and agreement was approved by the unanimous consent of the Board.

An agreement was presented and read between the Long Island State Bank and Trust Company and the Bank of the Manhattan Company, of the City of New York, whereby the Bank of the Manhattan Company will hold securities of the Long Island State Bank and Trust Company viz: \$11,000, Town of Riverhead, N. Y. (Highway) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ % bonds due October 1, 1934-44, \$14,000, Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, School District, 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ % bonds due May 1, 1945-48, as collateral to secure deposits of the Town of Riverhead, the Long Island State Bank & Trust Company, receipt of the above mentioned securities being acknowledged by the Bank of the Manhattan Company, and said agreement having been approved by Milton L. Burns as Supervisor.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED that this Board approve the securities viz: \$11,000, Town of Riverhead, New York, (Highway) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ % bonds due October 1, 1934-44 and \$14,000, Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, School District, 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ % bonds due May 1, 1945-48, of the Long Island State Bank & Trust Company, placed with the Bank of Manhattan Company, as collateral to secure deposits of the Town of Riverhead with the Long Island State Bank & Trust Company. The vote, Justices Stackpole and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, NO 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

Town Welfare Officer Burr addressed the Board regarding the matter of Town Welfare Garden units.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED that Town Welfare Officer M. M. Burr, with his discretion, is authorized to spend the sum not to exceed \$60.00 for the purpose of purchasing garden units from the Town of Brookhaven. The vote, Justices Stackpole and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, NO 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

Justice Stackpole offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Luce.

WHEREAS application has been duly made to the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York, for the laying out of a certain highway to extend from the northerly end of River Avenue commencing at or about the point of intersection of River Avenue with Riverside Drive and continuing in such a manner that the same intersects with East Main Street in said Town of Riverhead and

WHEREAS certain owners of lands to be included within the said highway have dedicated, released and conveyed to the said Town of Riverhead, for highway purposes the following lands:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate in the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York shown and designated as a proposed highway on a certain map made by D. R. Young, Surveyor, Riverhead, New York, dated October 11, 1932, heretofore filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead aforesaid, the center line of said conveyed premises being described as follows:

Beginning at a point 26.5 feet east of a monument set on the northerly side of Riverside Drive; running thence North 15 deg. 47 min. West 166.79 feet; thence North 22 deg. 0 min. West 1201.73 feet; North 77 deg. 5 min. West 179.38 feet; running thence North 66 deg. 50 min. West 541.80 feet; running thence North 74 deg. 5 min. 30 sec. West 1135.54 feet to the southerly side of East Main Street, and

WHEREAS such street or highway as proposed crosses the tracks of the Long Island Railroad and the said Town of Riverhead, pursuant to Section of the Railroad Law, gave due notice to the Long Island Railroad Company of its intention to lay out such a highway as hereinbefore described and

WHEREAS, in accordance with such notice, a hearing was given to said Long Island Railroad Company upon the question of the necessity of such a street, on the 10th day of April, 1934, and due consideration having been given and due deliberation having been had,

NOW BE IT RESOLVED "That the Town Board of the said Town of Riverhead deeming such road to be necessary and believing that the public interest requires the laying out of such street or road hereinbefore described, hereby orders the laying out of such street or highway and directs that all necessary proceedings be taken for the laying out of the same". The vote, Justices Stackpole, Yes, Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total votes, Yes 3 to 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

The Town Board recessed at 12:00 O'clock noon to convene on May 2, 1934 at 10:00 A. M.

The Town Board reconvened at 10 A. M. May 2, 1934.

Communication was read from the Town Board of the Town of Southampton in regard to the water rate between the Riverhead and the Riverside Water Districts.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce, it was Resolved by unanimous consent that the matter be held over until May 8, 1934 at 10 A. M.

Communication was read from Phillip Goldsamt in regard to contributing some dresses to a few of the needy women in Riverhead.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Rubenstein, it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the Town accept this kind offer and that the Town Clerk acknowledge the letter with thanks.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay to the order of the G. A. R. Post the sum of \$50.00 for Memorial Day expenses, the sum of \$150.00 to the order of St. Peters Hospital, Brooklyn, N. Y., and the sum of \$150.00 to the order of the Suffolk County Historical Society. The amounts being appropriated in the budget for 1934. The vote, Justices Burnside, Stackpole, Luce and Rubenstein, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Rubenstein, it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay to the Riverhead Motor Sales Company the sum of \$15.50 for an automobile for the use of the Police Department of the Town of Riverhead, amount to be paid from the unexpended balance of the 1933 Contingent Account, and that the insurance, maintenance and running expenses of the car also be paid from the unexpended balance of the 1933 Contingent Account. The vote, Justices Burnside, Stackpole, Luce and Rubenstein, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

The Town Board then convened as Board of Audit and examined the bills for the month of April.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the Board adjourned till May 8, 1934.
