

The minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, June 12, 1934 at 10 A. M.

The minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held May 29th 1934 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

Communication received from Congressman Robert L. Bacon, regarding the request of the Town of Riverhead, for five additional lights in the west end of Peconic Bay to mark the channel leading to the Peconic River was read, advising the Board that this matter has been given careful consideration, but it is regretted that favorable action cannot be taken in the matter at this time as the relatively small amount of traffic using this bay is not considered of such importance as to warrant the Lighthouse Service in establishing and maintaining the aids requested. The communication was ordered placed on file.

An opinion received from Reginald C. Smith, Town Attorney, was read advising that no tax is imposed by Chapter 12A of the Tax Law on gasoline sold to the Town of Riverhead for use in the automobiles of the Police and Highway Departments and that the Federal Tax on gasoline is not due on gasoline sold to the Town of Riverhead for these purposes. The opinion was ordered placed on file.

The following resolution was received from the Town Board of the Town of Southampton which was duly adopted by them at a meeting held on May 29th 1934 and which was certified by the Town Clerk of the Town of Southampton:

WHEREAS the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead has by resolution offered to this Board to furnish water at wholesale from the plant of the Riverhead Water District in the Town of Riverhead to the Riverside Water District in this Town at a rate of 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents per thousand gallons, for a period of one year from the 1st day of February 1934 and

WHEREAS it is necessary for this Board to take such action as will assure the said Riverside Water District with a supply of water from said date:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the rate of 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents for water to be supplied to the Riverside Water District in this Town of Southampton, offered by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead as Commissioners of the Riverhead Water District be and it hereby is accepted for the term of one year from the 1st day of February, 1934.

On motion duly made by Justice Burnside and seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was RESOLVED, that the above resolution be accepted and placed on file. The vote, Justices Burnside, Stackpole, and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

A Resolution received from the Board of Supervisors of the County of Suffolk, duly adopted on May 28, 1934, approving the application for the establishment of a sewer district in the Town of Riverhead within the area designated in the petitions now circulated for the establishment of a sewer district, was read and ordered placed on file.

A petition for two additional street lights on Sixth Street of the Camp Grounds in the South Jamesport Lighting District signed by taxpayers in said District was presented and referred to a Committee composed of Justices Luce and Burnside for investigation.

The matter of proposing additional projects for the Town of Riverhead was brought to the attention of the Board. A Committee composed of Justices Luce and Burnside was appointed to look into the matter.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED, That the Supervisor borrow in the name of the Town of Riverhead the sum of \$1823.46 on certificates of indebtedness for a period of six months pursuant to Section 10 of Chapter 798 of the Laws of 1931 as amended by Chapter 259 of the Laws of 1933, for the purpose of the payment of the Welfare bills for the month of May. The vote, Justices, Burnside, Stackpole and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total votes, Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

On motion duly made by Justice Burnside and seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay the sum of \$130.00 to George H. Conklin and Walter Sowinski, in accordance with a resolution passed on April 10, 1934. The vote, Justices Burnside, Stackpole and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total votes, Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

Supervisor Burns presented his report for the month of May, pursuant to Section 120 of the Town Law, and by unanimous consent was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Town Clerk advised that the bond of John H. Leonard, Special Policeman had been filed in the office of the County Clerk, pursuant to Section 25 of the new Town Law and that a receipt for same had been received and placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as Board of Audit and examined the bills of the Welfare Department for the month of May.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the Board adjourned till June 26, 1934 at 10 A. M.
