

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on August 14, 1934 at 10:00 A. M.

Minutes of a meeting held on July 31, 1934 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

The notice of a hearing pursuant to Section 130 of the Town Law on the question of an Ordinance restricting the traffic on Roanoke Avenue between Second Street and Main Street in the Town of Riverhead to North bound traffic only was read.

A communication was read from Dr. Harold B. Smith protesting against making any part of Roanoke Avenue a one way street.

A petition signed by nineteen residents and taxpayers of the Town of Riverhead living in the vicinity of Roanoke Avenue, requesting that the Town Board continue to permit two-way traffic on said Roanoke Avenue was read.

Mr. Walter F. Barnes addressed the Board in regard to the above matter requesting that Roanoke Avenue be continued as a two way traffic highway but suggested that parking be ~~eliminated~~ on one side or both sides.

Mrs Harold B. Smith addressed the Board suggesting the parking on Roanoke Avenue be allowed on one side only and restricted to two hour parking.

Mr. Herman Aldrich addressed the Board objecting to making Roanoke Avenue oneway traffic and suggested that parking be restricted to the West side of Roanoke Avenue.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED, that Roanoke Avenue in the Town of Riverhead be continued as a two-way traffic highway. The vote, Justices Burnside and Stackpole, absent, Justices Rubenstein and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

A request from the Eagle Hose Company to hold a Block Party on Sweezy Avenue between West Main Street and the Railroad on August 25th, 1934 was presented to the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Luce and seconded by Justice Rubenstein it was RESOLVED, by unanimous consent to refer the matter to the Dept. of Highways.

The petition in regard to changing the name of the street now known as East Avenue Extension to Park Avenue was presented to the Board.

The Board directed the Town Clerk to notify the petitioners that as the Town already has a highway named "Park Avenue," the Committee in charge of the above matter suggest that the petitioners submit another name for the Avenue.

A communication from Wilfred B. Corwin of 37 Lansdowne Drive, Larchmont, N. Y., applying for the position as operator of the proposed Sewerage Disposal Plant in the Town of Riverhead was read and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Burns presented his report for the month of July pursuant to Section 120 of the Town Law, and by unanimous consent was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Town Clerk submitted an affidavit that he has posted the Notice of Special Election to be held August 17, 1934 in five conspicuous places at least ten days prior to the election.

The affidavit was ordered placed on file.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED, that John B. Schmitt be and he hereby is appointed Town Accountant, at the pleasure of the Board, for the current year of 1934, for the purpose of auditing all Town Accounts, salary to be fixed at the rate of \$500.00 per year, money to be paid from the General Town Fund. The vote, Justice Burnside, Yes, Justice Stackpole, absent, Justices Rubenstein and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

Mr. John B. Schmitt, Accountant submitted a report of his examination of Town Accounts for the years 1932 and 1933, pursuant to a resolution by the Town Board at a previous meeting.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Burnside, it was RESOLVED, by unanimous consent that the above report be accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to transfer the sum of \$1892.59 from the General Town Fund to the Town Welfare Fund for the purpose of paying the Welfare bills for the month of July. The vote, Justices Burnside and Stackpole, absent, Justices Rubenstein and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as Board of Audit and examined Town Welfare bills for the month of July.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the Board adjourned till August 28, 1934 at 10:00 A. M.
