

ORDERED, that a special meeting be held by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead at the Town Board Room on the Southeasterly corner Roanoke Avenue and Second Street in said Town on the 2nd day of October, 1934, at ten O'clock in the forenoon at which time and place said Board will consider said petition and hear all persons interested in the subject there- concerning the same.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED, that the foregoing Order be and it hereby is adopted, pursuant to Section 193 of the Town Law. Justices Burnside and Rubenstein absent, Justices Stackpole and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing Order, and further

RESOLVED, that the Riverhead News be and it hereby is designated the official Newspaper for the publication of said Order pursuant to statute made and provided. The vote, Justices Burnside and Rubenstein absent, Justices Stackpole and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Above resolution by unanimous consent amended by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Luce as follows:

RESOLVED, that the Riverhead News be and it hereby is designated the official newspaper for one publication of the aforesaid Order on the 30th day September 1934, pursuant to a statute made and provided, and further

RESOLVED, that the County Review be and it hereby is designated the official newspaper for one publication of the aforesaid Order on the 27th day of September, 1934, pursuant to a statute made and provided. The vote, Justices Burnside and Rubenstein absent, Justices Stackpole and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. Herman Aldrich, representing the Riverhead Taxpayers Association addressed the Board, stating that the Association wish to go on record in favor of using a portion of the gasoline tax money refunded to the County by the State in paying off some of the bonded indebtedness and interest of Suffolk County.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED, by unanimous consent that this meeting adjourn till Saturday, September 22, 1934 at 1 P. M.
