

Minutes of a Public Hearing held by the Town Board in the Town Hall on Tuesday October 23, 1934 at 7:30 P.M.

Budget Hearing Notice.

Please take Notice that the Annual Estimate of the Town of Riverhead has been completed and filed in the Office of the Town Clerk and that a hearing for the review thereof will be held at the Town Hall on Second Street and Roanoke Ave. in said Town on the 23rd day of October 1934 at 7:30 P.M.

Supervisor Burns thereupon advised that the hearing was open to the Public and all who desired could be heard at this time.

Mr. Jesse Payne addressed the Board and asked for information and for an explanation of the duties of a Town Attorney and made the following recommendations; reduction of Town Attorneys salary, reduction of Budget Estimate of the Police Department and a reduction of the Estimate of the Riverhead Street Lighting District.

Mr. John Bagshaw addressed the Board and recommended the reduction of the salary of the Town Attorney and the reduction of the Highway Estimate to the extent of buying only 10 cars of road oil instead of 35 cars.

Mr. Dwight T. Corwin, representing the Riverhead Taxpayers Association addressed the Board and made the following recommendations. The Police Department Estimate amounting to \$19,497.00 be reduced to \$15,700.00, approved the appropriation of \$450.00 for purchasing a motorcycle and the necessary amount of expenses to run the automobile and the motorcycle. The salary of the four Justices of the Peace be reduced from \$1800.00 to \$1500.00 per year, and also recommended the reduction of the Welfare Estimate from \$18,000.00 to \$15,000.00.

Mr. Dennis G. Homan addressed the Board and made the following recommendations, reduction of the salaries of the Justices of the Peace from \$1800.00 to \$1200.00. Opposed the installation of blinker lights in the Peconic Bay.

Mr. George W. Hildreth addressed the Board and recommended that the Board appropriate \$750.00 for the installation of five blinker lights to mark the channel of Peconic River.

Mr. James Hagen addressed the Board and recommended that all

traffic lights be turned off at 1 A.M.

Mr. Lewis C. Austin addressed the Board and recommended that the candle power of all street lights be reduced.

Mr. Cedric Luce addressed the Board and opposed the traffic light at the intersection of Main Road and Edwards Avenue, Calverton.

Mr. Russell Robinson addressed the Board and recommended the installation of a Police telephone system in the Town.


Mr. Horace J. Wells addressed the Board and opposed the telephone system.

Mr. M. N. Ammann addressed the Board and recommended that the Town Board get a better rating for Street Lights from the L.I. Lighting Company.

Mr. Daniel R. Young addressed the Board and recommended that Item #1 of the Highway Estimate should be increased if anything.

There being no one else desiring to be heard, the Supervisor declared the hearing closed.
