

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the
Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday,
January 25, 1933 at 2 P.M.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting of January
11, 1933 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication was read from Gerard P. Hajek, Post
Adjutant of the Van Rensselaer Skidmore Post No. 2476,
Veterans of Foreign Wars, requesting that the Town Board
appropriate a sum of money to be used in paying rental
of quarters for Post Meetings.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded
by Town Clerk Burns and carried it was Resolved That the
Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to
pay the sum of \$125.00 to Van Rensselaer Skidmore Post
No. 2476 and the sum of \$125.00 to American Legion Post
No. 273, the sum of \$250.00 having been raised by taxation
for Post rent.

A communication addressed to William H. Barnes, from
Dorothy C. Kempf, Chairman, Riverhead Division, Suffolk
County Citizens Committee for Mosquito Elimination, was read,
requesting that some of the money allotted to Riverhead Town-
ship for emergency unemployment relief, be used for the
purpose of ditching the salt meadows at Wading River for
the purpose of mosquito control.

This matter was referred to the Highway Committee and
the Superintendent of Highways for investigation and report.

The Audited Bills Committee reported having inspected
bills of Dr. Vincent A. Doroszka and the Riverhead News, Inc.,

and recommended that the bills be paid as submitted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of Eight Thousand (\$8,000) Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of January 24, 1933

Supervisor Homan addressed the Board relative to the County Welfare work and the Board was also addressed by Thomas E. Greene and Mrs. Eva Young and Mrs. L.Y. Robinson.

A state ment by the Board of Water Commissioners of the Riverhead Water District, of Cash Receipts and Disbursements for the Fiscal Year ending October 31, 1932 was read.

On motion by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and carried it was Resolved That the Report of the Water Commissioners be filed and that a letter be forwarded to the Water Commissioners of the Riverhead Water District, expressing the thanks of the Town Board for the co operation of said Board of said Board of Water Commissioners

A bill in the amount of \$3109.09 by the Long Island State Bank & Trust Company for 1926 bank tax refund was presented, having been referred to the Town Board by the Town Board of Audit.

On motion by Justice Stackpole, seconded by Justice Rubenstein and carried it was Resolved that the bill of the Long Island State Bank & Trust Company for Bank Tax Refund in the amount of \$3109.09 for 1926 be held over to await the decision of the higher courts on the appeal now pending and be it further Resolved That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the L.I. State Bank & Trust Company.

Supervisor Homan requested the Audited Bills Committee to look into the matter of the Barter System now being advocated in parts of the country and report its findings at a future meeting of the Town Board.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on February 8, 1933 at 2 P.M.
