

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, March 15, 1933 at 2 P.M.

Town Superintendent of Highways Raymond C. Welch was present.

The Highway Committee reporting on the offer of the Beehive Store for land to be used for parking space, advised that considerable money would have to be expended for fill to place this land in proper condition for parking space. The committee was requested to continue on this matter.

The Police Committee was continued on the matter of extending the boundaries of the two hour parking district.

Superintendent of Highway Raymond C. Welch advised that he believed he could improve the northerly end of Howell Avenue at a later date.

The Highway Committee reporting on the matter of the proposed new shore road from Pier Avenue to Penny's Landing Road, advised having inspected the proposed course of the road and were of the opinion that some of the curves could be eliminated and requested that the committee be continued so that they might meet with the landowners committee and go over the matter more thoroughly. The Supervisor thereupon requested that the committee be continued.

Mr. Harry J. Newton addressed the Board and requested that the Town Board look into the matter of the lack of drainage of Merritt's Pond, the water in which was at such a height that it was flooding the cellars in that vicinity.

On motion by Justice Stackpole, seconded by Justice

Burnside and carried it was Resolved That the Highway Committee be and it hereby is requested to investigate in the matter of the lack of proper drainage facilities for Merritts Pond with authority to employ counsel to look into the matter as to the rights of the Town.

The Highway Committee reporting on the request of the Superintendent of Highways for authority to purchase a tractor and road plane at a cost not exceeding \$3,500.00, and the matter having been referred to the Highway Committee with power to act, advised having recommended the purchase of such a tractor and road plane.

On motion duly made by Justice Frederick, seconded by Justice Burnside and carried it was Resolved That the request of William L. Miller for permission of the Town Board of Riverhead, to survey and definitely mark and establish the town line between Brookhaven and Riverhead Towns from Wading River to the head of Peconic River, without cost to the Town of Riverhead, be and the same is hereby granted providing that a copy of his findings be furnished the Town of Riverhead for the town records.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the Meeting adjourned to meet on March 29, 1933 at 2 P.M.
