

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, March 29th. 1933 at 2 P.M.

Town Superintendent of Highways Raymond S. Welch, was present.

Supervisor Homan being absent, on Motion duly made seconded and carried Justice Burnside was appointed to act as Chairman of the Meeting.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting of March 15th. 1933 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

On motion duly made, by Justice Frederick, seconded by Justice Stackpole and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificate of indebtedness, the sum of Six Thousand (\$6,000.00) Dollars to pay on account of Audited Bills of March 28, 1933

A communication was received from Bishop and O'Keefe, Counselors at Law advising that the automobile of Mrs. Eeland Y. Robinson had been struck on the top by a limb falling from a tree while parked on a Town Highway, and enclosing a bill for repairs to said car in the amount of \$10.00 and asking that a check be forwarded without delay.

This matter was referred to the Superintendent of Highways and the Highway Committee for investigation and report.

A communication was received from J. Ebb Weir, President of J.E.Weir, Inc., advising that peddlers were bringing truck loads of evergreens and shrubs into the Town and peddling same in violation of the Ordinance as passed by the Town Board. Mr. John DeWeerd, representative of J.E.Weir, Inc., addressed the Board concerning this matter

and was advised to call the Police Headquarters in the Town should occasion demand and have the peddlers brought before a Justice of the Peace.

The Board was addressed by Edward C. Duryea, George Benjamin and John Carter of South Jamesport, who requested that the streets in South Jamesport be opened according to a resolution of the Town of May 28, 1930. This matter was referred to the Highway Committee and the Superintendent of Highways with power to employ counsel, if necessary, and report at the next Town Board meeting.

The Highway Committee reporting on the complaint that the drainage system from Merritts Pond was not properly draining the overflow from said pond, requested that they be empowered to employ counsel in this matter.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Highway Committee be and it hereby is empowered to employ counsel in connection with the matter of the lack of proper drainage facilities in the section near Merritts Pond.

The Police Committee reporting on the request for an extension of the two hour parking regulation to include West Main Street to Osborn Avenue, reported that no action should be taken in this matter until the entire business section of the Town could be considered.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, April 12, 1933 at 2 P.M.
