

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, May 10th 1933 at 2 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the Town Board Meeting of April 26, 1933 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A request of Rev. Joseph A. Zimmerman, Pastor of the First Congregational Church of Riverhead, to make Benjamin Place a one-way street, was referred to the Highway Committee.

A communication was read from Mr. D.C. Robinson, the owner of a lot 100 ' by 200 ', at Wading River, offering to lease said land to the Town for parking purposes, the terms of the lease being the Town to place the land in suitable condition for parking, the rental being the amount of taxes on the land, the term of the lease to be five years and all improvements made on the land to become the property of the owner at the expiration of the five year lease. This communication was referred to the Highway Committee for investigation.

A petition from Everett E. Brown to the Superintendent of Highways to lay out a highway in the Town of Riverhead, beginning at a point on the southerly side of Hubbard Avenue and running to Peconic Bay was read and referred to the Highway Committee. Releases was also presented from the owners of the property through which this proposed highway would pass.

A communication was read from the Island Daily News, quoting a price of \$89.60 for publishing the Supervisor's Annual Report for the year 1932 and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Alan G. Straight, Principal Operative, Division of Secret Service, Treasury Department,

expressing the appreciation of Division of Secret Service for the valuable assistance rendered ^{by} Special Constables Roswell Homan and Walter Luce in bringing about the capture of persons passing counterfeit money in this vicinity. This communication was ordered placed on file.

Justice Rubenstein, reporting for the Highway Committee, on the matter of laying out a highway from Riverside Drive to East Main Street, advised that the committee was in favor of laying out this highway if the land will be dedicated to the Town, that the Estate of E.H. Howell had not as yet agreed to dedicate the necessary land and requested that Justice Stackpole interview Mrs. Howell and ascertain if Mrs. Howell would dedicate said land. Justice Stackpole stated she would take the matter up with Mrs. Howell.

A communication from William H. Barnes, Chairman of the Temporary Emergency Work Relief Committee, Riverhead, N.Y. was read, advising the Board that several complaints had been registered in the Bureau to the effect that the contractor doing the work on Northville Turnpike, was not employing local men on this work and further stating that this matter should be rectified immediately. This matter was referred to the Highway Committee for investigation.

Justice Rubenstein, reporting for the Highway Committee on the matter of draining the meadow land at Wading River in order to eliminate mosquitoes, advised having inspected the meadow land and was of the opinion that this work could be done without much cost due to the system of ditches in the meadow land at the present time.

Justice Frederick reporting for the Highway Committee on the proposed highway extending from Pier Avenue to Penny's Landing Road, read a report of Attorney R. Condon Smith, in connection with this matter, which was ordered placed on file, and offered the following resolution which was duly seconded by Justice Stackpole:

Whereas, Chauncey H. Young and others have heretofore made application to the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, for a consent to be given to the Town Superintendent of Highways of said Town, to lay out a highway from Penny's Road to Pier Avenue, in said Town, and

Whereas, a committee appointed by said Town Board consisting of Justice Rubenstein and Justice Frederick, has reported in favor of said application, provided the land taken for said proposed highway should be dedicated to the Town, and

Whereas, there has been presented written and duly executed dedications of the land proposed to be taken by said highway, together with a map and survey thereof,

Now Be it Resolved, pursuant to the provisions of Section 191 of the Highway Law, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, hereby consents that the Town Superintendent of Highways of said Town, make an order laying out such highway upon filing and recording in the County Clerk's Office and the Town Clerk's Office, a map of said proposed highway, and a release of the land from the owners thereof.

A roll call vote on the foregoing resolution was as follows:

The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Frederick and carried it was Resolved, that the following regulations be made a part of the now existing parking regulations that were adopted in 1928 by the Town Board of Riverhead, Riverhead, New York.

No. 15A . No automobile or other vehicle shall park within the area on Roanoke Avenue on the west side of said street from the corner of East Main Street to the property now occupied by Dr. Harold B. Smith, nor on the east side of said street from the corner of East Main Street to First Street, for a period longer than two (2) hours between the hours of nine (9:00) A. M. to six (6:00) P.M.

No. 15B. No automobile or other vehicle shall park within the area on Griffing Avenue on the west side of said street from the corner of West Main Street to the property now occupied by Graff Brothers Barber Shop, nor on the east side of said street from the corner of West Main Street to the north end of the property occupied by the Long Island Lighting Company, for a period longer than two (2) hours between the hours of nine (9:00) A. M. and six (6:00) P.M.

No. 15C. No automobile or other vehicle shall park with-

in the area of West Main Street on the north side of said street from the Lord Building to the west boundary of property now occupied by Dettner Electric Company, nor on the south side of said street from a point directly opposite the Lord Building to a point opposite the Dettner Building, for a period longer than two (2) hours between the hours of nine (9:00) A. M. and six (6:00) P.M.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Police Committee was authorized to have the necessary notices of the foregoing regulations published.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on May 24, 1933 at 2 P.M.
