

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, June 14, 1933 at 2 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting of May 31, 1933, were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Automatic Voting Machine Corporation, advising that if additional voting machines would be required for the Fall election that orders for same should be placed as soon as possible in order to insure delivery.

Supervisor Homan appointed Justice Rubenstein and Town Clerk Burns, a committee to look into the matter of voting machines and referred the communication to said committee.

A communication was read from John S. Howe, President of the L.I. State Bank & Trust Company, inquiring as to when the bank tax refund would be paid. Supervisor Homan advised the Board that he had phoned Mr. Howe, advising that no refund would be made until the Courts have decided the matter and the letter was ordered placed on file.

Frank M. Corwin, Secretary of the Suffolk County Agriculture Society, addressed the Board requesting that an ordinance be adopted by the Town Board prohibiting the parking of automobiles on the north side of Pulaski Street and the east side of Osborn Avenue during the week of the County Fair, advising of the dangers of having the cars so parked.

On motion duly made by Justice Frederick, seconded by Justice Stackpole and duly carried it was Resolved That the matter of prohibiting the parking of automobiles of the north side of Pulaski Street and on the east side of Osborn Avenue,

adjacent to the property of the Suffolk County Agriculture Society, be and the same hereby is referred to the Police Committee with power to act on the matter and have the necessary notices published.

A communication was Robert Cunningham of Nesconset was brought to the attention of the Board and ordered placed on file.

Mr. Fred H. Tuthill addressed the Board advising that the Civic Club of Riverhead desired to compliment the Town Board on the correcting of the dangerous gutter condition on the north side of West Main Street and Court Street, and also to call the attention of the Town Board to the danger to the public of the maple trees on the south side of West Main Street, near the property of the Suffolk County Historical Society further, advising that some of the trees should be removed and others moved back as in their present position they constitute a dangerous condition. Mr. Tuthill also asked that the private road leading south from Peconic Bay Boulevard to several houses near the Peconic Bay be oiled. No action was taken on this request as it was reported that the Town would not be in a position to purchase enough road oil to properly oil the town highways.

Justice Stackpole, reporting on the matter of attempting to obtain the dedication of land from the Estate of E. H. Howell in order to lay out a highway from East Main Street to Riverside Drive, advised that she had been unable to see Mrs. Howell owing to the illness of Mrs. Howell but had interviewed her son, Merton, who had requested that no condemnation proceedings to started until after July 1, 1933, it being thought that the matter could be talked over with Mrs. Howell in the meanwhile.

The opinion of Attorney Cecil B. Tooker, relative to the New Town Law was read, and acting on the request of Attorney Tooker, Supervisor Homan appointed a committee to look into the matter and confer with counsel, consisting of Justices Burnside, Stackpole, Frederick and Rubenstein.

A communication from the National Surety Corporation, enclosing certificate assuming the liability of the National Surety Company, under Bond No. 9364-A- Forrest G. Downs, as Receiver of Taxes, was read. The certificate was ordered attached to the bond and the communication was ordered placed on file.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on June 28, 1933.
