

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, November 8, 1933 at 8 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the Public Hearing on the Budget of October 31, 1933 and the minutes of the Town Board meeting of October 31, 1933 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Stackpole and duly carried it was Resolved That the sum for Clerk Hire and Supervisors Clerk under Item No. 11, Miscellaneous Fund be reduced from \$4200.00 to \$3000.00 and that the sum of \$900.00 under Highway Item No. 4, Miscellaneous Fund for compensation of Clerk be eliminated from the budget as proposed.

On motion duly made by Justice Frederick, seconded by Justice Stackpole and carried it was Resolved That the sum allowed under Highway Item No. 4, Miscellaneous Fund for Engineer fees in the proposed budget be reduced from \$1500 to \$1200.00

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein, seconded by Justice Stackpole and carried it was Resolved That the compensation of Inspectors of Election be fixed at \$10.00 per day for all services rendered on primary, registration and election days and for completing and filing returns with the Board of Election and the Town Clerk.

On motion duly made by Justice Frederick, seconded by Justice Stackpole and duly carried it was Resolved That there be included in the budget for the year 1934, the sum of \$150.00 for maintenance of the grounds of the Suffolk County Historical Society and the sum of \$150.00 as a contribution to St. Peters Hospital of Brooklyn, N.Y., said sums having been voted by the taxpayers of this town at the general election held on November 7, 1933.

On motion duly made by Justice Frederick, seconded by Justice Stackpole and duly carried it was Resolved That the following Budget for the Year 1934 be and the same is hereby adopted:

This Board having canvassed and estimated the votes given in the several Election Districts of said Town, at the Town Election held at the time of the General Election on November 7, 1933, do hereby certify, determine and declare that:

Milton L. Burns, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Supervisor in and for said Town.

Harry J. Kratoville, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Town Clerk in and for said Town.

Forrest G. Downs, by the greatest number of votes, was duly elected Receiver of Taxes in and for said Town.

William H. Clark, by the greatest number of votes, was duly elected Superintendent of Highways, in and for said Town.

Robert Burnside and George E. Luce, by the greatest number of votes, were severally duly elected Justices of the Peace in and for said Town.

Israel D. Luce, by the greatest number of votes, was duly elected Assessor for Two Years, in and for said Town.

Charles O. Morse, by the greatest number of votes, was duly elected Assessor for Four Years, in and for said Town.

George H. Perkins, by the greatest number of votes, was duly elected School Director, in and for said Town.

This Board having canvassed and estimated the votes

relative to the following Town Propositions, given in the several election districts in the said Town at a Town Election, held at the time of the General Election on Tuesday, November 7, 1933

Town Proposition No. 1.

Shall there be inserted in the tax levy for the year 1934 and for the Year 1935, the sum of One Hundred Fifty Dollars, for maintenance of the grounds of the Suffolk County Historical Society, which have been laid out as a park open to the public?

Town Proposition No. 2.

Shall the Town of Riverhead, purchase a tract of land bordering the Howell M. Reeve Memorial Park on the west for the sum of \$18,000.00, for park purposes.

Town Proposition No. 3.

Shall there be inserted in the tax levy for the year 1934 and for the Year 1935, the sum of One Hundred Fifty Dollars, for the purpose of contributing said amount to St. Peters Hospital of Brooklyn, N.Y., in consideration of treatment of such poor patients that may be sent to said institution from the Town of Riverhead?

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes cast on Town Proposition No. 1, was Seven Hundred Forty Eight of which there were Five Hundred Thirty Two were for and Two Hundred Sixteen votes cast against.

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes cast-Town Proposition No. 2 was Seven Hundred Thirty Three votes-there were Two Hundred Eighty Three votes for the proposition and were Four Hundred Fifty Votes against the proposition.

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes cast-Town Proposition No. 3- was Seven Hundred Thirty Three- there were Four Hundred Fifty Two votes for the proposition and there were Two Hundred Sixty One Votes against the proposition.
