

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Thursday, January 5, 1932.

Superintendent of Highways, Raymond C. Welch, was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held December 31, 1931 were read for information.

The report of the Town Nurse, Miss Marion L. Jacobs, for the month of December 1931 was presented and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Homan appointed the following committees for the year 1932-1933

Lighting Committee - Justice Stackpole and Justice Rubenstein.

Highway Committee- Justice Rubenstein and Justice Frederick.

Sanitation Committee- Justice Rubenstein and Justice Burnside.

Audited Bills - Justice Frederick and Justice Stackpole.

Police Committee- Justice Burnside and Justice Rubenstein.

Superintendent of Highways Raymond C. Welch, addressed the Board advising that the Highway Machinery was in very poor condition and requested that the Highway Committee investigate same. The Sup't. of Highways also advised that he desired to trade in the Dodge car used by the Superintendent and purchase a new car.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Highway Committee be empowered to act with the Superintendent of Highways and purchase a new car for the use of the Superintendent of Highways trading in the Dodge car of the Superintendent of Highways.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was

Resolved That the Highway Allowance of the Supervisor be and the same hereby is fixed at \$900.00 per year and that the Highway Allowance of the Town Clerk be and the same is hereby fixed at \$150.00 per year.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized to purchase necessary supplies for the town offices.

Mr. John T. Hill addressed the Board, stating that he believed an incinerator should be constructed in the Town and that a sewer system should be installed in order to better the sanitary conditions of the Town and also advised that many people desired the Town Board to meet in the evenings.


The Superintendent of Highways was authorized to have a notice of the closing of the Aquebogue Dump inserted in each of the local papers for two weeks.

The Highway Committee was requested to investigate the sewer which has been constructed under the sidewalk on East Main Street at the Orchard Court Apartment.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes addressed the Board calling the attention of the Board to the fact that the tenth of January fell on Sunday of this year and asking if he should collect taxes without penalty on said date.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Receiver of Taxes be and he hereby is authorized to collect taxes without penalty up to and including the eleventh of January 1932.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on January 13, 1932 at 2 P.M.
