

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, January 15, 1932 at 2 P.M.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting held January 5, 1932 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication received from the Riverhead Town Planning Board was read, requesting that the Board provide the necessary funds for the Town Planning Board to enter into a contract with a competent planning engineer to plan the Town of Riverhead. Mr. J. Irving Edwards, Secretary to the Riverhead Town Planning Board addressed the Town Board advising that the Planning Board was heartily in favor of employing Ernest P. Goodrich, Planning Engineer, to plan the Town of Riverhead. On motion and vote, it was decided to hold this matter over for a future meeting of the Board.

Mr. Fred H. Tuthill and Frank E. Woodhull addressed the Board requesting that a sidewalk be constructed on the westerly side of Peconic Avenue, from the Southampton Town Line north to the existing sidewalk on said avenue, a distance of about 150 feet. Supervisor Homan referred this matter to the Highway Committee for investigation and report.

Mr. George W. Creighton, Jr., addressed the Board, advising that he represented twenty or twenty-five taxpayers of the Town of Riverhead, who desired a highway laid out in the easterly part of the Village to be a continuation to the north of River Avenue, from Riverside Drive to East Main Street, near the Saw Mill Brook Lane. This matter was referred to the Highway Committee for investigation.

Supervisor Homan requested Justice Burnside to act on the Highway Committee during the illness of Justice Rubenstein.

Mr. Kominski came before the Board advising that he had suffered damages to his land and crops last summer from road oil which covered a portion of his farm land after a heavy

rainstorm. This matter having been before the Board before the Highway Committee was requested to take the matter up with Mr. Kominski.

Supervisor Homan submitted a letter which he had received from the L.I. Railroad Company advising that the station would not be closed at 3 P.M. as was rumored.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That Lorimer M. Raynor be and he hereby is appointed Dog Enumerator of and for the Town of Riverhead to enumerate the list of dog owners during the month of January 1932.

There being no further business, on motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Meeting adjourned to meet on January 27, 1932 at 2 P.M.
