

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, July 27th. 1932 at 7:30 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting held July 13th. 1932 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication received from Gus Brooks, of Riverhead, requesting that an additional street light be installed on Sweezy Avenue south of the residence of Gus Brooks, was read and referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

A communication from A. A. Tuthill relative to the highway running across his property at Wading River was read and ordered placed on file.

The Lighting Committee reporting on the matter of the control for traffic signal light at the corner of Second Street and Roanoke Avenue, advised that the traffic control signal had been loaned to the Town of Riverhead by the Littlefield Alger Company and recommended that the Littlefield Alger Company bill the Town for said control and that the bill be paid.

On motion duly made and seconded it was Resolved That the report of the Lighting Committee relative to the purchasing of the traffic control now in use at the corner of Second Street and Roanoke Avenue be received and that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay said bill for said traffic equipment.

The resolution was thereupon declared carried.

Justice Frederick reporting for the Committee authorized by the Town Board to act on the request of James G. Giannakakis for permission to open a refreshment stand at Howell M. Reeve Park, advised that said committee has given the applicant permission to open such a stand at the Park in space designated, with the understanding that the applicant would install a pump for the benefit of the public and would keep the Town Beach clean.

Bills of Dr. Vincent Doroszka and the State X Ray Laboratory Service for services rendered, which had been referred to the Town Board by the Town Board of Audit, were on motion and vote referred to the Audited Bills Committee for investigation.

Attorney Cecil B. Tooker, representing Mr. A. A. Tuthill in the road matter at Wading River, addressed the Board, advising that in his opinion this matter was a question of law and requested that the matter be referred to an Attorney.

A copy of the Map of the road said to lead from The Landing Road to Wading River Creek, at Wading River, N.Y. surveyed by William L. Miller, in the year 1912 was presented.

On motion duly made and seconded it was Resolved That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to appoint an Attorney to represent the Town of Riverhead, in the matter of the road leading from The Landing Road to the Wading River Creek at Wading River, N.Y.

The resolution was thereupon declared carried.

Mr. Fred H. Tuthill, representing the Civic Club, addressed the Board, suggesting that a sign be placed at the corner of

West Main Street and Osborn Avenue, reading " TO NEW YORK CITY ",also calling the attention of the Town Board to the dangerous condition existing at the corner of Court Street and West Main Street caused by the deep gutter at this point, also advising that the Town Highways were being used to park used For Sale automobiles, and also suggesting that signs be placed along highways where dumping of garbage was being carried on.

These matters were referred to the Highway

Mr. John T. Hill addressed the Board asking if the curb and gutter improvements were being done by contract or by days work and also inquiring if the Town was being paid for the field stone being taken from the old curbs and gutters.

Attorney Seth Hubbard, representing the Superintendent of Highways, in the matter of straightening out Hubbard Avenue, presented Quit Claim Deeds for the consideration of the Town Board, which were referred to the Highway Committee for recommendation.

Mr. Peter Demetriou, Proprietor of the Garden Restaurant addressed the Board, asking that the curb in front of his place of business be lowered so that automobiles might park without damage to fenders and hub caps and advising that this condition was injurious to his business. This matter was referred to the Highway Committee for investigation.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on August 10, 1932 at 2 P.M.
