

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, September 28, 1932 at 2 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting held September 14th, 1932 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication received from Guy O. Walser, County Attorney, relative to refund due the National Bank, was read and ordered placed on file.

The Highway Committee reporting on the complaint at the Town Dock, Riverhead, advised that a sign should be placed at said dock and that the existing regulation relative to the tying up of boats at the dock be enforced.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificate of indebtedness the sum of \$4,000 to pay on account of audited bills of September 27, 1932.

A petition was presented signed by taxpayers residing at South Jamesport, requesting that the contemplated Town Dock to be erected on Aeonic Bay at South Jamesport, be erected on the site formerly occupied by the Jamesport Wharf and Ways Company. This petition was referred to the Highway Committee by the Supervisor.

Justice Rubenstein advised that Robert E. Riley desired to know if the Town Board would be interested in hiring land in the rear of the Beehive Store, which is being erected on East Main Street, Riverhead, for a Parking Space.

The Highway Committee was requested to investigate the matter of parking spaces near the business section of the Town and report its findings at a future meeting of the Board.

Supervisor Homan brought to the attention of the Board, the matter of Special Constables, advising that the present appointments would expire on October 1, 1932, and requested that the members of the Board express their opinions on the matter. The Police Committee, consisting of Justice Burnside and Justice Rubenstein, advised that in their opinion, that the same number of men should be appointed if the schools were to be policed and if all night police service was to be continued in the Town.

On motion by Justice Stackpole, seconded by Justice Rubenstein, it was Resolved That this Board express a vote of confidence in the Police Committee and hereby approve of the appointment of the same number of regular Special Constables as have worked during the past six months, at the same rate of compensation as is now paid.
