

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Tuesday, October 11, 1932 at 2 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the Town Board Meeting of September 28th. 1932 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication from Adam Hill, Jr., Ticket Agent of the Long Island Railroad Company, calling the attention of the Board to the Week End Excursions of the Long Island and Pennsylvania Railroad Companies, was read.

The report of the Town Nurse for the Month of September 1932 was read and ordered placed on file.

On motion duly made by Justice Burnside, seconded by Justice Frederick and carried it was Resolved That the Suffolk County National Bank, the Suffolk County Trust Company and the Long Island State Bank & Trust Company be and each of them is hereby designated as a depository for the funds of the Receiver of Taxes,

R. Condon Smith, Attorney for Alice G. Tuthill of East Main Street, Riverhead, presented a claim in the amount of \$400.00 for damages said to have resulted by reason of the change of grade of the Town highways known as Union Avenue and East Main Street. Supervisor Homan ordered the claim placed on file and the matter referred to the Highway Committee and the Superintendent of Highways.

Lewis C. Austin addressed the Board, asking if the usual election notices were to be published this year. There being some question as to the authority of the Town Board to authorize the publishing of election notices, the Supervisor referred the matter to the Audited Bills Committee for investigation with power to act in the matter.

A representative of the Scovill Road Marker addressed the Board and presented for the consideration of the Board, the Scovill Road marker, which is a brass disk to be sunk into cement roads and which is designed to take the place of street paint. The matter was referred to the Highway Committee.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the compensation of Sadie Goldberg, Clerk who has been assisting in the extension of the tax roll, be and the same is hereby fixed at \$5.00 per day.

The Board was advised that Benjamin Davis was willing to consider a proposition for the storing of the Town Highway Machinery in the rear of the property of Davis Brothers, Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead and this matter was referred to the Highway Committee for investigation.

Supervisor Homan requested the Highway Committee to advise as to the present status of the plans for the Town Dock at South Jamesport and Justice Frederick advised that this matter in his opinion should be held over until the next meeting of the Town Board.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, October 26, 1932.
