

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the  
Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednes-  
day, October 26, 1932 at 2 P.M.

Present:-

was present.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting of October 11th.  
1932 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication was read from Bruno Panewicz asking  
that a curb be constructed in front of the A & P. Store  
on Pulaski Street which was referred to the Highway  
Committee and the Superintendent of Highways.

A communication was read from C.G.K. Wollslager, Pastor  
of the Lutheran Church of Riverhead, requesting that a  
curb and gutter be constructed on Griffing Avenue and  
Pulaski Street, around the Church property. This matter  
was referred to the Superintendent of Highways and the  
Highway Committee.

A petition was presented by residents of Deephole Road  
and Middle Road asking that the Town Board see if some-  
thing could be done to end the dragging of dirt on these  
highways by the employees of the Superintendent of High-  
ways, the petition further stating that this action caused  
clouds of dust to be raised by passing automobiles, which  
makes it impossible to open windows of their homes and  
soils their clothing.

Sup't. of Highways Welch asked Mr. Nathan T. Corwin  
who is in charge of the roads in this territory to tell  
the Board of the conditions on the above mentioned roads,  
and Mr. Corwin advised that the farmers in this section  
were using several feet of the highways for farming purposes  
and that the roads were being used by the farmers to turn  
around on and thereby pulling dirt from the farms into  
the highways and causing the dust of which they are now  
complaining.

Supervisor Homan suggested that the signers of the Petition be requested to attend the next regular meeting of the Town Board and the Town Clerk was instructed to notify the signers of said petition requesting that they appear before the Board at its next regular meeting.

A Petition, signed by taxpayers of the Town of Riverhead, was presented, requesting that the Superintendent of Highways lay out a Highway in the Town of Riverhead, which shall be a continuation of River Avenue, commencing at or about the point of intersection of River Avenue with Riverside Drive and continuing in such manner that the same will intersect with East Main Street, the proposed highway will pass through lands now or formerly of George W. Creighton, Jr., Ethel Howell, Estate of E. H. Howell, Estate of William T. Britton, Herbert H. Howell, William Kramer, Fred E. Meyer, Charles E. Beach and one Van Middelens, and said proposed highway shall have a width of fifty feet throughout its entire distance. This Petition was referred to the Highway Committee and the Superintendent of Highways.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of \$2,000.00 to pay on account of Audited bills of October 25, 1932.

Supervisor Homan requested the Audited Bills Committee to look over the amounts necessary to be raised by taxation this year and requested that the Highway Committee be ready to make any recommendations for amounts necessary for highway purposes.

It was moved and carried that a Meeting of the Town Board be held on Friday, November 4, 1932 for the purpose of making up the Budget for the year 1933. The Town Clerk was authorized to have notices of said meeting published twice in the Riverhead News and the County Review.

The Highway Committee reported having looked into the matter of the claim of Alice G. Tuthill for \$400.00 for damages said to have been suffered by reason of the change of grade of Union Avenue and East Main Street, and advised that in their opinion no damage had been done to her property and recommended that the claim in the amount of \$400.00 be rejected.

The Town Clerk was instructed to have notices inserted twice in the County Review and the Riverhead News that Voting Machines would be open to the public for instruction in the Town Office.

Forrest G. Downs, Tax Receiver of the Town of Riverhead, presented the Board with a Statement of Penalties, Fees and Bank Interest collected on the 1931 Tax Levy and requested that this Board forward a Release of the Bonding Company to the County Treasurer.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That this Board hereby approves of the releasing of the Bonding Company by the Town of Riverhead, for Bond issued, bonding Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes of the Town of Riverhead for the collection of the 1931 taxes.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
