

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, December 7, 1932 at 2 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was also present.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting of November 23, 1932 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of \$5000.00 in anticipation of taxes to retire five Water District Bonds of \$1000.00 each

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the compensation of the Town Clerk for Election services as per Section No. 49 of the Election Law, be and the same hereby is fixed at \$200.00 for the year 1932.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That Frank Sowinski be and he hereby is appointed Dog Enumerator of and for the Town of Riverhead to prepare a list of owners and haborers of dogs in the Town of Riverhead.

A petition was presented signed by Samuel Atkins, Asher Holeston, E. E. Ruland, Maude E. Ruland and Harry J. Newton, requesting that the culverts and drains loacted at or near the intersection of Northville Turnpike and Elton Street be lowered so that the water from the creek leading from Merritts Pond road may properly drain.

The Board was also addressed by Clifford Jackson of Hampton Bays relative to the matter of culverts and drains from Merritts Pond and after considerable discussion, the Sup't. of Highways was requested to take this matter up with the County Engineer.

The Opinion of Attorney Edwin M. Lockwood, relative to the Refund of the 1926 Bank Tax to the Suffolk County National Bank, was read, advising that the Town of Riverhead, should refund to the Suffolk County National Bank, the sum of \$2811.09 plus interest, a total amount of \$3811.02, and not the sum of \$3994.85 as claimed.

A communication was read from Ellis S. Duvall, President of the Suffolk County National Bank, advising that the total amount due the National Bank from the Town of Riverhead had now been found to be \$3,811.02.

On motion duly made and seconded it was Resolved That The Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to refund to the Suffolk County National Bank for 1926 Bank Tax, the sum of \$2811.09 plus interest making the total amount of the refund \$3811.02.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

By the unanimous consent of the members of the Board, the Opinion of Attorney Edwin M. Lockwood was read in the matter of the contemplated town dock at South Jamesport. The opinion being to the effect that the Town Superintendent of Highways did not have authority to build such a dock to be paid for by the Town at large, the Town Clerk was directed to write the State Comptroller and ascertain to what fund the \$3,000.00 raised in the tax levy under Item No. 1 of the Highway Tax, should be transferred.

The Town Clerk was directed to file the opinions of Edwin M. Lockwood.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned.
