

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, February 25th, 1931 at 2 P. M.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held February 11, 1931 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication received from Lester G. Conklin, requesting that the Superintendent of Highways take steps to better the condition of Howell Avenue, Village of Riverhead and said communication was referred to the Road Committee and Superintendent of Highways for investigation.

A letter was read, received from the War Department enclosing photostatic copies of the areas for which application had been received from L. D Smith to dredge and on motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That this Board oppose the granting of the permit and be it further Resolved That a telegram of protest be forwarded to the War Department to this effect.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Town Clerk be directed to notify the Long Island Lighting Company to install one 80 C.P. street light on Ostrander Avenue, Riverhead, north of their present termination.

The Lighting Committee reporting on the petitions for and against the installation of a street light at South Jamesport in front of the Post Office, recommended that the petition for the street light be denied.

On motion duly made, seconded and unanimously approved it is Resolved That this Board spread on its minutes an expression of its regret at the great loss which the Town and Community has sustained by the sudden death of the late B. Frank Howell, a former Supervisor, of its appreciation of the

valuable services rendered by him both as a public official and as a private citizen and of his helpful influence and interest in all public affairs and a further expression of its sincere sympathy with the members of his bereaved family in this their time of sadness and grief and it is further Resolved That the Clerk be instructed to send a copy of this resolution to Mrs. B. Frank Howell, his widow.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, March 11, 1931 at 2 P. M.
