

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, April 1, 1931 at 9 P.M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

Mr. Littlefield of Littlefield Alger Electric Company, addressed the Board relative to installing a traff-o-matic signal light at the corner of the Middle Island Road and the Port Jefferson Road, Calverton, N.Y.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Littlefield Alger Electric Company, be instructed to install a traff-o-matic signal light at the corner of the Middle Island Road and the Port Jefferson Road at a cost not to exceed \$1775.00, providing electric current can be obtained in this locality and providing permission for the erection of a traffic signal light can be obtained from the State Highway Department.

A communication received from Robert P. Griffing, was read, congratulating the Town Board for having work done on the trees of the Town by the Davey Tree Expert Company.

The Town Clerk was instructed to acknowledge receipt of this letter and the letter was ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Homan appointed Justice Burnside and Justice Frederick, a committee to conduct the Water District Election on April 6, 1931 from 2 P.M. to 4 P.M.

Mr. Maude of the Davey Tree Expert Company addressed the Board relative to additional work on the Town trees at this time and this matter was left to the Town Superintendent of Highways to decide.

On motion of Justice Conklin, seconded by Justice Burnside,

it was Resolved That the present committee consisting of Justice Miller and Justice Frederick be and it hereby is authorized to seek available river front properties, suitable for a town dock, obtain prices for same, have surveys and maps made of said properties with the idea in view of submitting propositions to the taxpayers of the Town at the next Town Election as to whether or not the Town shall purchase and improve a site for a Town Dock and be it further Resolved That the present Town Dock be left as it is for the present.

The resolution was thereupon declared carried.

The Supervisor advised that he had been advised by counsel that he was allowed a clerk and that the Board of Assessors and the Receiver of Taxes were allowed to hire clerks and that the compensation of all said clerks must be fixed by the Town Board.

It was decided to hold the April meetings of the Town Board of April 15th and April 29, 1931 at 2 P. M.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness the sum of \$6,000.00 to pay on account of audited bills of March 31, 1931.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned.
