

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, October 28, 1931 at 2 P.M.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting held October 14, 1931 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

Supervisor Homan suggested that the matter of paying taxes in January and July be investigated and Justice Frederick and Justice Conklin were appointed a committee to look into this matter and report at a future meeting of the Board.

On motion duly made and seconded the following appropriations were made for the tax levy for the year 1932.

South Jamesport Lighting District	\$ 900.00
Wading River Lighting District	\$3500.00
Riverhead Lighting District	\$9000.00

A roll call vote on the foregoing resolution was as follows:-

The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificate of indebtedness the sum of THIRTY FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS to pay on account of audited bills of October 27, 1931.

The tax rolls for the Town of Riverhead, handed to the County Treasurer by Forrest G. Downs, Tax Receiver, having been audited by the County Treasurer and having been found correct, and penalties in the amount of \$1400.73 and interest in the amount of \$220.66 having been paid to the Supervisor by the Tax Receiver, Now therefore Be It Resolved that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, does hereby approve of the audit of said tax rolls as made by the County Treasurer.

A bill in the amount of \$500.00 submitted to the Board of Audit and held over for action by the Town Board, for damages to ducks owned by Lawrence E. Hulse, said to have been caused by rats from the Town Dump at Aquebogue, was presented and the Town Clerk was requested to have Mr. Hulse present this bill in another form for the consideration of the Board.

It was decided to hold a public hearing on Thursday, November 5, 1931 at 7:30 P.M. for the purpose of considering the 1932 budget. The Town Clerk was instructed to have notices to this effect published for two weeks in each of the local papers.

The Justices of the Peace and the Town Clerk decided to meet on Wednesday November 4, 1931 at 1 P.M. to canvass the vote of the town ticket.

On motion and vote the meeting adjourned.
