

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Offices on Wednesday, March 26, 1930 at 2 P. M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held on March 12, 1930 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A petition for three additional street lights in the South Jamesport Lighting District signed by taxpayers in said district was presented and referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of Thirty Five Hundred Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of March 25, 1930.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways presented a map made by Daniel R. Young, Surveyor, showing highways in South Jamesport as laid out on a map filed in the Office of the County Clerk a number of years ago and requested that the Town Board pass a resolution accepting said highways as Town Highways.

WHEREAS, the Village of South Jamesport was laid out in streets and blocks more than fifty years ago and a map thereof filed in the County Clerk's Office, and lots having been sold according to said map and Whereas the Town of Riverhead has worked said streets for more than fifty years,

Now Therefore be it Resolved that the Town of Riverhead, accept said streets as shown on said map, as they have been monumented, as town highways, all of said highways being more than two rods in width, and Further Be It Resolved that a map made by Daniel R. Young, Surveyor, in March 1930 be and the same is hereby made a part of the records of the Town Highways.

The Determination and Agreement for the expenditure of Highways moneys as presented by the Superintendent of Highways was duly approved and signed by members of the Town Board.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized to purchase an outside sign for the Town offices and individual signs for the several town offices.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the Zoning Commission appointed by the Board be invited to attend the next meeting of the Town Board.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Town purchase from Charles McCabe, a desk for the Town Board Meeting Room, according to specifications, at an agreed cost of Three Hundred Thirty Five Dollars and also six chairs for use in said meeting room.

It was moved, seconded and carried That a Special Constable be stationed at the Polish Church on Sundays and Special Church Days from the hours of 8 A. M. to 12 o'clock noon, to assist in regulating traffic in this locality.

Complaints having been received by Supervisor Homan, about boats tying up at the Town Dock indefinitely, thereby making it impossible for said docks to be used by the public, and whereas a law was passed by the State of New York in 1915, giving the Town Board of Riverhead authority to make laws, rules and regulations in regard to the Town Dock, Supervisor Homan appointed Justice Burnside and Justice Conklin, a committee to look into this matter and make recommendations to the Board as to what laws, rules and regulations should be enacted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That Daniel R. Young be and he hereby is authorized to make a survey and map of the Town Dock showing what portion of this property is owned by the Town of Riverhead.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on April 9, 1930 at 2 P. M.
