

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, April 9, 1930 at 2 P. M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the last meeting of the Town Board were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

The committee having charge of drafting rules and regulations in regard to the Town Dock property, advised that a map had been furnished of this property and that the committee would proceed to draw up rules and regulations to be submitted to the Board.

Supervisor Homan appointed Justices Burnside and Conklin a committee to look into the matter of purchasing chairs for the court room.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent advised that he intended to advertise for bids for 300,000 gallons of road oil and that said bids would be opened at the next meeting of the Town Board on April 30, 1930 at 2 P. M.

The lighting committee reporting on the petition of taxpayers of South Jamesport, recommended that the petition be granted and that the Lighting Company be authorized to install three additional street lights in the South Jamesport Lighting District.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Long Island Lighting Company be notified to install three eighty candle power street lights within the South Jamesport Lighting District, one light on Railroad Avenue near the residence of David Wells, one on Point Street between First and Second Street, in rear of property of Halsey Tuthill, one on Willow Street between First and Second Street, near the property of Charles Bergen.

Messrs. Littlefield and Van Riper representatives of the Littlefield-Alger Electric Company, presented a proposition to install new traffic signal lights at a total cost of \$3410.00.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to enter into a contract with the Littlefield - Alger Electric Company, for the installation of new General Electric traffic signals at a total cost of \$3410.00 installed.

Mr. Van Riper of the Littlefield Alger Electric Company advised that the State would give permission for the town of Riverhead to install disc markers in the concrete at the approaches to the railroad bridge west of Riverhead and on motion and vote it was Resolved That the Littlefield Alger Electric Company be and it hereby is authorized to install disc markers at the approaches to the railroad bridge west of the village of Riverhead.

The Planing and Zoning Commissioners as appointed by the Town Board were present and advised that they believed that they should have either the advice of planing experts or legal advice in connection with their work so that the work would be properly done.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That Cecil B. Tooker be relieved of his duties as Planing and Zoning Commissioner and that Daniel R. Young be and he hereby is appointed Planing and Zoning Commissioner in place thereof and That Attorney Cecil B. Tooker be and he hereby is appointed counsel to the Planing and Zoning Commissioners at regular legal fees.

Supervisor Homan advised that the constables of Southold Town were assisting in enforcing the Supervisors' law relative to seed clams as passed in 1924 and requested

That this Board request that William B. Walters, Jr., be appointed Special Game Protector by the Conservation Department of the State in order to assist in enforcing said law of the Board of Supervisors.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That this Board request of the Conservation Department of the State of New York, the appointment of Constable William B. Walters, Jr., as Special Game Protector to assist in enforcing the law relative to seed clams as passed by the Board of Supervisors of Suffolk County in 1924.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, request the assistance of the State Police, Deputy Sheriffs of Suffolk County and Town Constables in enforcing the law relative to the taking of seed clams as passed by the Board of Supervisors of Suffolk County in the year 1924.

The Town Clerk was directed to forward copies of the foregoing resolution to the Village Trustees of Incorporated Village of Southampton and to the Town Board of the Town of Southampton.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday April 30, 1930 at 2 P. M.
