

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, April 30, 1930 at 3 P. M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held April 9, 1930 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A petition for street lights on Howell Avenue, within the Riverhead Lighting District was presented and referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

Charles O. Downs opened the bids for road oil which were as follows:

After some discussion by representatives of the oil companies and the members of the Board, Charles O. Downs, announced that he would reject all bids.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of three thousand dollars to pay on account of audited bills of April 29, 1930.

Supervisor Homan advised that he had received offers from different people to purchase the old furniture which was of no use to the Town and on motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to sell said furniture.

The committee having charge of drawing up rules and regulations to govern conditions at the Town Dock Property, advised having looked the situation over and were of the opinion that a sign should be posted to the effect that the dock was to be used for receiving and discharging passengers only would eliminate a great deal of the difficulty.

The matter of appointing a bay constable was discussed but no action was taken at this time.

George Skinkaytis of South Jamesport was present and advised that the Superintendent of Highways was opening a road at South Jamesport and going through property which he had purchased and for which he held a deed.

It was moved, seconded and carried that a committee be appointed by the Supervisor to look into the complaint of George Skinkaytis in reference to the highway being opened and that said committee be empowered to employ counsel in connection therewith if necessary.

Supervisor Homan appointed Justice Miller and Justice Conklin on this committee.

A communication received from Arthur M. Tyte protesting against the condition of the pond in the rear of his property on East Main Street caused by the duck farm bordering on the west side thereof, was read and referred to a committee consisting of Justice Miller and Justice Fafinski. It was suggested that this committee investigate the matter and also take it up with the County Board of Health.

An opinion was rendered by Attorney Almon G. Rasquin in relation to the status of Water Commissioner George E. Luce whose term of office expired on April 16, 1930, advising that the Town Board should appoint a Water Commissioner to fill the vacancy, such appointment to expire on the date of the next annual election, April 6, 1931, at which time there should be elected a commissioner for two years the balance of the unexpired term.

On motion duly made and seconded it was RESOLVED That George E. Luce, be and he hereby is appointed Water Commissioner of the Riverhead Water District to fill vacancy now existing said appointment to expire on the date of the next annual election, April 6, 1931

A roll call vote on the foregoing resolution was as follows:

The Supervisor thereupon declared the resolution duly carried.

Mrs. M. N. Ammann and Mrs. I. M. Young, representatives of the Delphian Club were present and exhibited specimens of the signs to be erected at the entrance to the Village of Riverhead advising that the total cost of the signs wrected would be \$50.00 each.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That this Board authorize the erection of three signs at the entrances to the Village of Riverhead, at a cost of \$50.00 each, said cost to be paid by the Town of Riverhead, and be it Further Resolved That the Delphian Club and the High School students who competed in the contest for a suitable sign be and they hereby are voted a ~~vote~~ ^{of} thanks by the Town Board of Riverhead, for their interest in this matter.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on May 14, 1930 at 2 P. M.
