

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, May 28, 1930 at 2 P. M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board of May 14, 1930 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A letter/received from the Department of Public Works State of New York, advising that the tentative estimate for the Town Share of reconstructing Highway #3066 Port Jefferson-Riverhead Part 3, on Peconic Avenue, would be \$2180.00.

A petition from residents and taxpayers of Pulaski Street, Riverhead, was presented requesting that larger street lights be installed in this section and referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent, advised that the bids received for road oil on May 21, 1930 were as follows-

Warner Quinlan	.0497	per gallon
Standard	.06	per gallon
Texas Company	.0615	per gallon

and that he had accepted the lowest bid.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the following ordinance was duly adopted:

" It shall be unlawful for any person to set off at any time any firecrackers whatever on the public highways in the Town of Riverhead, and it shall also be unlawful for any person or persons to built bonfires or set off any fireworks on the public highways in the said Town of Riverhead at any time. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished in a case of conviction by a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not exceeding six months or by both such fine and imprisonment"

The Town Clerk was instructed to have the foregoing ordinance published in the County Review and the Riverhead News each week until July 4th.

A communication received from Howard A. Wells, Clerk of the Village of Northville advising that at a Special Election held in Northville that the proposition " Shall the Village of Northville, Suffolk County, New York, be dissolved as an incorporated Village was carried by a vote of 61 Yes to 2 No. This letter was ordered placed on file.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Town Clerk be and he hereby is instructed to write letters to Justice Burnside and Justice Fafinski expressing the regret of the members of the Board at their illness.

It was moved seconded and carried that the Supervisor be authorized to sell one steel desk and chair to Justice Conklin at the price that same cost the Town.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That a legal opinion be obtained from Attorney J. Harry Saxstienas to the fees allowed by law to a constable in the performance of his duties.

The committee having charge of looking into the matter of the highways recently accepted by the Town of Riverhead as Town Highways at South Jamesport recommended that the Superintendent of Highways proceed to open said highways.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, June 11, 1930 at 2 P. M.
