

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, August 27, 1930 at 2 P.M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

Minutes of the meeting of the Town Board of August 13, 1930 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A communication from the Rev. Bernard J. Quinn, Rector of the Little Flower Institute at Wading River, requesting street lights on the road to said Institute, was read and referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

A petition was presented from property owners adjoining Tuthills Path requesting that the name of said road to be changed to Tuthills Avenue.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the name of Tuthills Path be and the same is hereby changed to Tuthills Avenue.

A communication received from the War Department, advising that a application had been received from Mr. Henry A. Hallock of Northville for permission to dredge in Long Island Sound to a depth of 10 feet below mean low water, was read and ordered placed on file.

Mrs. Jones of South Jamesport was present and called the attention of the Board to the dangerous condition of the trees in South Jamesport especially the willow tree in front of her dwelling.

Charles O. Downs, Town Sup't, of Highways advised that several trees were in the highway on East Avenue and that the trees in front of the residence of Vivian Hajek on East Main Street would have to be removed in order to lower the sidewalk when placing curb and gutter in this section.

Supervisor Homan appointed Justice Conklin a committee to act with Town Sup't. Charles O. Downs, and investigate the trees and to make the necessary arrangements to have have such trees as is necessary removed.

Charles O. Downs requested that the Board meet and inspect the town highway known as Park Avenue leading to the Town Park property.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that this Board meet on Wednesday, September 3, 1930 and inspect the highway leading to the Town Park property on the Sound.

Supervisor Homan suggested that one Justice of the Peace act as a committee in charge of the Special Constables for a period of one month and that a Special Constable be requested to attend the Town Board meetings for the purpose of co-operating with the Board in police matters.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned.
