

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, Wednesday, May 29, 1929 at 2 P. M.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held May 15, 1929 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of Thirty Nine Hundred Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of May 29, 1929.

A deed was presented by William H. Sweezy and Elizabeth V. Sweezy dedicating a tract of land to the Town of Riverhead, running south from Osborn Avenue to the present termination of Sweezy Avenue.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That this Board accept the land dedicated by William H. Sweezy and Elizabeth V. Sweezy running south from Osborn Avenue to the present termination of Sweezy Avenue.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That Lorimer M. Raynor be and he hereby is appointed Dog Enumerator of and for the Town of Riverhead.

The bond of Frank E. Ruskowski was presented bonding Frank E. Ruskowski as Constable of and for the Town of Riverhead with Ellis T. Terry and Asa D. Fordham, as sureties, and said bond was approved by the Supervisor and ordered placed on file.

Theodore Worona of Wading River, was present regarding street lights at or near his residence and this matter was referred to Justice Miller for investigation.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Town Board meet once a month during the months of June, July and August and that the regular monthly meeting be held on the Wednesday following the last Tuesday of the month.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the name of the Town Highway known and designated as Center Street, which connects Northville Turnpike with Fifth Street be and the same hereby is changed to St. John's Place.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the Town Clerk was authorized to order necessary street signs to replace broken signs.

The Board recommended that the Sup't. of Highways have a light coating of road oil applied on Sweezy Avenue in the event that the concrete road will not be laid in the near future; that the material remaining from the road drain recently installed be removed and that the Superintendent of Highways look into the request of John R. Hogan for raising the gutter in front of his residence. The Town Clerk was instructed to write the Sup't. of Highways accordingly.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That a new Election District be and the same hereby is created to be known as Riverhead Election District No. 7 as follows:- Beginning at the intersection of Northville Turnpike and Saw Mill Brook and running along Saw Mill Brook to center of Main Street, through the center of Main Street to center line of Hubbard Avenue, thence along center of Hubbard Avenue to Terry's Creek, thence along Terry's Creek to Peconic Bay, thence along Peconic Bay to Case's Creek, thence along Case's Creek to Peconic Bay Boulevard, thence along the center of Peconic Bay Boulevard to a point in line with the south course of Tuthill's Lane if extended, thence northerly up said extension if extended and the center line of Tuthill's Lane to Sound Avenue, thence across Sound Avenue a prolongation of the northerly course of Tuthill's Lane to the Long Island Sound, thence along Long Island Sound to Penny's Road, thence along the center line of Penny's Road to Sound Avenue, thence along Sound Avenue to Northville Turnpike, thence along center line of Northville Turnpike to point or place of Beginning.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED that Jamesport Election District formerly known as District 7 be and the same is hereby changed to Riverhead District NO. 8 and the western boundary of said district No. 8, shall be the eastern boundary of newly created election district No. 7

On motion and vote, it was Resolved that the eastern boundary of Riverhead Election District No. 6 shall be the western boundary of newly created election District No. 7.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED

That the Election District Map of the Town of Riverhead be corrected to show the eight election districts within the Town and that copies of said map be printed for use in the districts throughout the Town.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That it shall be unlawful for any person to set off at any time any fire crackers whatever on the public highways in the Town of Riverhead, and it shall also be unlawful for any person or persons to build bonfires or set off any fireworks on the public highways in the said Town of Riverhead at any time. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished in a case of conviction by a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not exceeding six months or by both such fine and imprisonment.

The Town Clerk was directed to have the foregoing Ordinance published in the local papers and to have posters printed and distributed about Town.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned.
