

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, March 28, 1928 at 3 P.M.

The minutes of the Meeting of the Town Board, held on March 14, 1928 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

An application for a franchise by the SOUTH BAY CONSOLIDATED WATER COMPANY, INCORPORATED, to lay and maintain water pipes under ground in all highways and roads over which the Town Board and the Superintendent of Highways has jurisdiction, within the Town of Riverhead, outside the Riverhead Water District, was read and on motion and vote ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Homan advised the Board, that the Board of Supervisors had granted him permission to use the County Property on the easterly side of Griffing Avenue, formerly the site of the Griffing House, as a public parking place.

The County Board of Supervisors having offered Supervisor Homan, the use of the County Property on the easterly side of Griffing Avenue, for a public parking place, on motion duly made, seconded and carried it is hereby Resolved that the Superintendent of Highways Charles O. Downs, be and he is hereby authorized to give such assistance as is necessary in cleaning up and laying out the property.

A petition of nomination signed by twenty six persons owning taxable real estate within the Riverhead Water District was presented and ordered placed on file.

Communications received from Water Commissioners O. Edmund Griswold, H. Harrison Corwin and William R. Duvall, advising that they would not be candidates for Election as Water Commissioners on April 6, 1928, were read and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Homan appointed Justice Burnside and Town Clerk Burns to officiate at the Election of the Water Commissioners, on April 6, 1928.

The lighting committee recommended that four street lights be installed on Corwin Street, between Fishel Avenue and Ostrander Avenue Extension, one street light on Ostrander Avenue Extension, north of Corwin Street, one street light on Newton Avenue, north of Corwin Street, and the present street light on Union Avenue, which is about 50 feet north of Corwin Street be moved to the corner of Union Avenue and Corwin Street.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the L. I. Lighting Company be directed to install four street lights on Corwin Street, between Fishel Avenue and Ostrander Avenue Extension, one street light on Ostrander Avenue Extension, north of Corwin Street, one street light on Newton Avenue, north of Corwin Street and the present street light on Union Avenue, which is about 50 feet north of Corwin Street be moved to the corner of Union Avenue and Corwin Street.

An application by Daniel R. Young, was submitted to the Board for a town highway connecting Raynor Avenue and Hamilton Avenue, and said application was held over for some future meeting of the Board.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificate of indebtedness the sum of Five Thousand Thirty Nine and 54/100 (\$5039.54) Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of March 27, 1928.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to meet at the call of the Chair.
