

The minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday October 10, 1928 at 2 P.M.

There were present:-

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held September 28, 1928 were read and on motion and vote, adopted.

A communication was read from The Business Men of Roanoke Avenue, requesting that Roanoke Avenue be more efficiently lighted by installing the necessary number of the bracket type of street lights and this communication was referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

A communication was read from Ralph C. Brown, calling the attention of the Board to the need of a sidewalk on the westerly side of Peconic Avenue, Riverhead, and this communication was referred to a committee consisting of Justice Conklin and Justice Miller for investigation.

A communication was read from Harry D. Sleight of Sag Harbor, quoting the charges made by him for bringing the records of the Town of Riverhead, up to date.

WHEREAS, an action has been commenced by Charlotte Vaneska against Hallock Luce, Health Officer of the Town of Riverhead, the summons and complaint in which action were served upon the said Hallock Luce on the 29th. day of September, 1928, for the unlawful imprisonment of Charlotte Vaneska in the State Hospital for the Insane at Central Islip, New York, on or about the 3rd. day of July, 1928, under the alleged charge that she was insane and a dangerous character, and

WHEREAS, the said Hallock Luce, Health Officer of the Town of Riverhead, did upon the request of members of the Town Board of Riverhead, and in the performance of his official duties as such Health Officer, examine the said

Charlotte Vaneska with reference to her mental condition after complaint made to members of the Town Board concern-
ingsuch mental condition and take such steps with reference
thereto as his official dulyrequired,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That Mallock Luce, the Health Officer of the Town of Riverhead, be and he hereby is instructed to defend the said action brought against him by Charlotte Vaneska in the Supreme Court of Kings County, and that said Mallock Luce, Health Officer of the Town of Riverhead, be and he hereby is authorized to employ Robert P. Griffing of Riverhead, N.Y. as his attorney in the defense of such action.

The Lighting Committee reporting on the Petition for additional street lights on Sweezy Avenue, Riverhead, recommended that an 80 C.P. light be installed on Sweezy Avenue near the Atlantic and Pacific Tea Company Store, that a 250 C.P. Light be installed on Sweezy Avenue, near the store of Frank D. O'Keefe in place of the 80 C.P. light at this point and that a 250 C.P. light be installed on Sweezy Avenue near the store of Bruno Panewich, in place of the 80 C.P. light at this point.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Long Island Lighting Company be instructed to install an 80 C.P. street light on Sweezy Avenue, Riverhead, near the Atlantic & Pacific Tea Company Store, and to install two 250 C.P. street lights on Sweezy Avenue, near the stores of Frank D. O'Keefe and Bruno Panewich, in place of the 80 C.P. lights now in use at these points.

Byron Rogers, Clerk of the Board of Assessors requested that he be authorized to employ a clerk to assist him with the tax roll.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That Byron Rogers, clerk of the Board of Assessors, be and he hereby is authorized to employ a clerk to assist him in preparing the tax roll for a period not exceeding six weeks at a weekly compensation of \$25.00

Daniel R. Young was present and advised the Board that he had made surveys of the drainage systems on Sweezy Avenue and Maple Avenue as requested, and estimated the total cost of laying 3 foot iron pipe from Sweezy Avenue, at the corner of Lincoln Street, to the River, to be \$4600.00 and the cost of laying 3 foot iron pipe to drain Maple Avenue, from near the residence of Mrs. Dimonon Maple Avenue, to

the Town Dook would be \$3700.00

The opinion of the Board was that a satisfactory method of draining Maple Avenue, could be brought about by the laying of iron pipe from Maple Avenue to the gutter on the easterly side of McDermott Avenue, a few feet south of Main Street and the Board recommended that this be done by laying three foot iron pipe under Main Street and two foot iron pipe the balance of the way.

Daniel R. Young presented a map showing the width of Northville Turnpike from Roanoke Avenue to East Avenue.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Town Board of Riverhead, authorize the Superintendent of Highways to employ Cecil B. Tooker, Attorney, as his counsel to represent him in the matter of the alteration of the highway in the Town of Riverhead, known as Northville Turnpike, formerly known as Fourth Street.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That all companies, firms or persons laying pipes or wires under highways within the Town of Riverhead, be directed to file maps with the Town Clerk, showing the location of said wires and pipes and be it further,

RESOLVED That maps be filed with the Town Clerk showing the present system of all pipes and wires under the highways within the Town.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to meet on October 31, 1928 at 2 P.M.
