

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday April 27, 1927 at 3 P.M.

Town Supt. of Highways, Charles O. Downs was present.

The minutes of the Meeting of April 20, 1927 were read and on motion adopted.

A communication from O. A. Hawkins of Jamesport advising the Board that he was not in favor of having sidewalks built in front of his property, was read and ordered placed on file.

A number of the Property owners of Fishel Avenue being present, a Public Hearing was held on the matter of sidewalks for Fishel Avenue.

The Board was addressed by William N. Burnite, Stanley Duvall, Jesse W. Payne, Miss Fietz and Almon G. Rasquin, representing Edward Conners, after which the Hearing was declared closed.

The Public Hearing on the matter of sidewalks at Jamesport was then taken up and the Board was addressed by Ellsworth P. Brown and Michael Bakowski.

The Hearing was then declared closed and this matter was held over to the next meeting of the Board.

A Petition was presented to the Board signed by a two-thirds of the resident Taxpayers of South Jamesport to form a Lighting District at South Jamesport, N.Y.

The Petition was ordered placed on file.

The Lighting Committee of the Town Board report in the matter of the application of tax payers in South

Jamesport for the establishment of a lighting district, that it recommends that such district be established and that the Town Clerk be instructed to insert in the local newspapers of the Town a Notice of the Application with the date when same shall be acted upon by the Town Board.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the report of the Lighting Committee was approved and the Town Clerk was instructed to insert the following advertisement in one issue of the local papers.

NOTICE.

An application by tax payers at South Jamesport, in the Town of Riverhead for the establishment at South Jamesport of a Lighting District within the boundaries as follows:

On the North by the center line of the Main Track of the Long Island Railroad, on the East by the Stream known as East Creek from its mouth on the Bay to the point where it would intersect said middle line of the Main Track of the Railroad, on the South by the Bay and on the West by a line drawn from the Bay at the center of the mouth of the West Creek and running Northerly from said point on a line parallel with Washington Avenue until said line would intersect the said middle line of the Main Track of the Railroad. This Application will be acted upon by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead at a Meeting thereof to be held in the Town Office on the fourth day of May, 1927 at 10 o'clock A. M.

Justice Burnside advised the Board that Frank Corwin of Riverside Drive had requested him to see if the Lighting District could be extended to include the section of Riverside Drive east of the present lighting district.

This matter was referred to Justice Burnside and Justice Vail, the Lighting Committee to investigate and report back to the Board

The matter of Traffic Signals at the abutment of Griffing Avenue and Main Street and at Roanoke Avenue and Main Street was taken up by the Board.

On motion of Justice Vail, seconded by Justice Penny it was RESOLVED that the Town Clerk notify the Horni Signal Manufacturing Corporation that the Board would now request that the Traffic Signals at the abutment of Griffing Avenue and Main Street and Roanoke Avenue and Main Street be placed on standards and that the Traffic Signals be extended over the Highway by means of an arm.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow upon Promissory note, the sum of Thirty Two Hundred Seventy One and 78/100 (\$3271.78) Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of April 26, 1927

Supt. of Highways, Charles O. Downs, invited the Board to inspect the Town Highways on Wednesday, May 4, 1927 which on invitation on motion and vote was accepted.

Meeting adjourned to meet on May 4, 1927 at 10 A. M.
