

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Monday, June 20, 1927 at 2 P.M.

Town Superintendent of Highways Charles O. Downs was present.

The minutes of the Meeting of June 8th. 1927 were read and on motion adopted.

Rev. Willis B. Holcombe, representing the Suffolk County Historical Society, was present and addressed the Board, relative to the World War Memorial, advising that lettering had been attached to the Memorial on the west side at a cost of \$138.00 and desired to ascertain if this charge should not be borne by the Town of Riverhead.

On motion and vote, the Supervisor was authorized to obtain an opinion as to how the Town can pay for the cost of lettering the World War Memorial.

Daniel R. Young addressed the Board and presented plans to ease the corner at East Jamesport Lane and the Main Road at Jamesport.

On motion and vote the matter of easing the corner of East Jamesport Lane and the Main Road at Jamesport was referred to the committee consisting of Justice Penny and Supt. of Highways Charles O. Downs with a request that they take this matter up with County Engineer A. O. Smith for advice.

Justice Corwin advised that he had attended the Hearing of the Public Service Commission at 120 Broadway, New York City, as Supervisor Howell had been unable to attend, and reported that the Commissioner had assured him that the pressure would be sufficient to take care of the needs of Riverhead. Justice Corwin also advised that the Gas Franchise had not been granted at this Hearing because the L. I. Lighting Company had not obtained permission to lay pipes from Ronkonkoma to the Riverhead Town Line.

Robert Cunningham addressed the Board requesting that the Town put the Old Country Road in good condition and make this road a fifty foot highway.

The Lighting Committee reported having met with the Riverhead Board of Trade in regard to the contemplated type of street lights for the business section of Riverhead and advised that the desired type of street lights had been selected and that they were now waiting for prices for same.

On motion and vote the following Fire Cracker Ordinance was duly adopted and the Town Clerk was directed to have same published in the local papers and have posters printed and distributed about the town:

Fire Cracker Ordinance

Notice is hereby given that at a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York, the following ordinance was presented and adopted according to law:

"It shall be unlawful for any person to set off at any time any fire crackers whatever on the public highways in the Town of Riverhead, and it shall also be unlawful for any person or persons to build bonfires or set off any fireworks on the public highways in the said Town of Riverhead at any time. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished in a case of conviction by a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not exceeding six months or by both such fine and imprisonment."

The authority to pass this ordinance is found in Art. 2 of the Public Health Laws of the State of New York.
