

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on May 18, 1927 at 2 P.M.

The minutes of the Meeting of May 4th. 1927 were read and on motion adopted.

A communication received from Park V. Arnold, Manager of the Long Island Lighting Company, in regard to a new street lighting plan for the business section of Riverhead, was read and referred to the Lighting Committee.

A communication received from Dr. Leonard Blumgard requesting that the Town Board extend the Lighting District at Wading River, was read and referred to the Lighting Committee.

Communications from the Lions Club of Riverhead, endorsing the proposed lighting plan of the Long Island Company and from the Municipal Signal and Equipment Corporation in regard to traffic signals were read and ordered placed on file.

Sales Manager Goodwin, of the Horni Signal Manufacturing Corporation addressed the Board in regard to the traffic signals now in use in Riverhead Village and advised that he would be pleased to submit plans for the consideration of the Board.

A delagation from the Riverhead Board of Trade was present and the Board was addressed by Samuel Harding and Benjamin Marcus in regard to better street lights for Riverhead; additional street lights on First and Second Streets and for better police protection in the Village especially on Saturday nights.

This matter was referred to the Lighting Committee to investigate and report back to the Board.

Ellsworth P. Brown, Special Constable of Jamesport advised the Board that he wished to tender his resignation as Special Constable to take effect at once and recommended that the Board appoint Reynold R. Ryan, as Special Constable.

On motion and vote, it was Resolved that the Board accept the resignation of Ellsworth P. Brown, as Special Constable and express its appreciation to Mr. Brown for the manner in which he had regulated traffic at Jamesport while Special Constable.

On motion and vote the Board fixed the hours for the Special Constable to be on duty at Jamesport at ten hours per day and that said Constable should be on duty from 10 o'clock A.M. to 8 o'clock P.M.

Supervisor Howell advised the Board that Benjamin Fanning had protested to him about the condition of the Town Dump and had advised him that the Town Lease had expired. The Town Clerk was directed to obtain the lease from Mr. Fanning for the guidance of the Board.

The Matter of fixing definite days for the Town Board to meet was taken up and held over for the consideration of the Board at some future meeting.

On motion and vote the Meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, May 25, 1937 at 2 P.M.
