

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, held in the Town Clerk's Office in said town on the 8th. day of January at 2 P.M.

Town Superintendent of Highways Charles O. Downs and Health Officer Dr. Allen G. Terrell were present.

A communication was read by the Town Clerk from the Board of Assessors appointing Byron Rogers as Clerk of the Board of Assessors from January 1, 1926 to January 1, 1927. Motion to place communication on file was made seconded and carried.

Dr. Allen G. Terrell read report from New York State Department of Health. Report was held over for the Board of Health Meeting.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried a meeting of the Board of Health was called to meet in the Office of the Town Clerk on Saturday, January 9th. 1926 at 2 P.M.

Mr. Horace Wells and E. P. Wells addressed the Board relative to taxes levied on Incorporated Village of Sound Avenue, for highway, machinery and snow removal.

Petition was read to continue street lighting from present termination on Roanoke Avenue to intersection of Roanoke Avenue and Sound Avenue, or any further point in this district as the Town Board sees fit to grant. It was moved, seconded and carried to place Petition on file.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the Town Clerk was appointed Registrar for a term of four years beginning January 1st. 1926 and expiring December 31st 1929.

On motion duly made seconded and carried Supervisor Howell was appointed Deputy Registrar for a term of four years beginning January 1st. 1926 and expiring December 31st. 1929.

Town Sup't of Highways Charles O. Downs addressed the Board relative to widening the road and narrowing the sidewalks between Roanoke Avenue and Griffing Ave.

On motion duly made seconded and carried Supervisor Howell was authorized to appoint a committee to consult with the property owners and see if releases could be obtained.

Supervisor Howell appointed Justices Dwight T Corwin and Raymond H. Vail and Sup't of Highways Charles O. Downs to serve on this committee.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$500.00 from the Miscellaneous Fund to the Machinery Fund.

Sup't. of Highways Charles O. Downs addressed Board relative to removing the large trees on the south side of Main Street in the business section.

Sup't of Highways addressed <sup>the</sup> Board relative to placing fire insurance on the town truck. By motion and vote, Supt. of Highways was authorized to cover trucks.

On motion duly made seconded and carried Sup't of Highways and Justice George E. Penny were appointed a committee with power to employ counsel to investigate and prepare plans of procedure for the widening of the present roadbed on Jmaesport Lane and the removal of the abutment of the Long Island Railroad Bridge crossing said highway.

On motion duly made seconded and carried Supervisor and Town clerk were authorized to purchase necessary supplies.

By motion and vote the compensation of Robert H. Cooper as Clerk of the Supervisor was fixed at \$1200. per year.

Sup't of Highways Charles O. Downs addressed Board relative to the removal of Gabage in the Village.

On motion and vote Supervisor Howell was authorized to transferr \$36.46 from the School Fund to the Contingent Fund.

Almon G. Gasquin addressed the Board about the removing of the Soldiers Memorial Monument at Main Street and Griffing Avenue.

By motion and vote the Board recommended that the sup't of Highways co-operate with the American Legion and remove same at the Town's Expense.

Meeting adjourned to meet at the Town clerk's Office on Wednesday January 27th. 1936 at 2 P. M.
