

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Office of the Town Clerk in said Town on the 28th. day of April 1926 at 2 P.M.

The minutes of the meeting of April 8th were read and on motion approved.

An opinion of Bernard H. Lord was read, regarding the right of the Town Board to cause a referendum to be had to vote on the question of whether or not motion pictures may be presented in a qualified theater on Sundays.

Cecil B. Tooker, representing Riverhead Playhouse, Inc. addressed the Board requesting an adjournment of this matter until the next meeting of the Board.

On motion and vote it was decided to hold this matter over until the next Town Board Meeting.

On motion and vote it was decided to hold the next Town Board Meeting on Wednesday, May 12th. at 2 P.M.

Mr. Baird addressed the Board relative to the Highway Line on Main Street.

On motion and vote the Supervisor was authorized to employ counsel to ascertain what steps are necessary to locate the Highway Line on Main Street, and to establish a new line on Main Street, one mile east and one mile west of Peconic Avenue if same is necessary.

A letter was read from the State Comptroller, returning check in the amount of \$11,084.20, which sum is the unexpended balance, plus accrued interest on the money deposited with the Comptroller, on account of additional width etc., in connection with Federal Aid Highway Contract No. 8181.

On motion and vote it was decided to use this money to retire all of the latest Bonds of the Riverhead-Mattituck issue.

On motion and vote it was: Resolved that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow the sum of \$1633.84 to pay on account of audited bills of April 27, 1926

Charles O. Downs, addressed the Board relative to the Cleveland Tractor belonging to the Town, and requested the right to sell same.

On motion and vote the Superintendent of Highways was authorized to sell the Cleveland Tractor belonging to the Town and deposit money for same in the Machinery Account.

Supervisor Howell read a letter from H. Nelson Smith, enclosing bills against the Town for supplies used by the Town Superintendent of Highways in 1923.

On motion and vote the Supervisor was authorized to employ counsel to ascertain the proper course necessary to have these bills paid.

Meeting adjourned to meet at the Town Clerk's Office on Wednesday, May 13th. at 3 P.M.
