

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Office of the Town Clerk in said Town on Wednesday, May 26, 1926 at 2 P.M.

Town Superintendent of Highways Charles O. Dows was present.

The minutes of the Meetings of May 12th. ^{and May 18th} were read and on motion adopted.

On motion and vote it was decided that the Board comply with advertisement which appeared in the papers and open the Bids for Road Oil.

Following is the result of bids for Road Oil.
Standard Oil Company of New York. \$.07 1/4 per gallon.

The Texas Company \$.07 1/4 per gallon.

The representative of the Sinclair ~~Oil~~ Refining Co., advised the Board that he did not have a sealed bid to present but that his bid on the Road Oil was \$.07 1/4 per gallon.

On motion duly made seconded and carried, it was RESOLVED that all bids for Road Oil be laid on the table and that no contract be issued for Road Oil.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow the sum of \$2221.67 upon promissory note to pay on account of audited bills of May 25th. 1926.

A notice from the Trust Company was read advising that a note in the amount of \$4500.00 was due on May 25, 1926. This note was to pay audited bills of November 24th. 1925 and was made for a period of six months.

On motion and vote it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to renew note, which matured on the 25th. day of May, 1926 in the amount of \$4500.00, the new note to be a demand note.

A letter from Ralph C. Brown addressed to the Supt. of Highways was read regarding the parking of cars in the business section of Riverhead by the merchants of Riverhead.

The opinion of the Town Board was that they were in accord with the plan of Mr. Brown, namely that the business people should find other places to park their cars during the day than the business section. The Town Clerk was directed to write Mr. Brown acknowledging receipt of his letter and advising him that the Board was in accord with his plan and suggesting that he take this matter up with the Lions Club to devise means of putting this plan into practise.

It was decided that the next meeting of the Town Board would be held at Wading River, in the Wading River School house on June 12th. 1926 at 2 P.M.

The next meeting to be a joint meeting of the Boards of Brookhaven Town and Riverhead Towns for the purpose of holding a public hearing on the establishment of a Lighting District at Wading River.

The Town Clerk was directed to advise the Supervisor of Brookhaven Town of this Meeting and to publish notice of the Public Hearing at Wading River in two issues of the local papers.

There being no further business, meeting adjourned.
