

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office in said Town on Wednesday, June 30th. 1926 at 2 P.M.

The minutes of the meetings of June 10th. and 12th. 1926 were read and on motion adopted.

G. Addison Jackson addressed the Board about the condition of the bridge crossing Peconic River at West Main Street, and requested the Board to take some action to have bridge repaired or destroyed.

An opinion of Bernard H. Lord was read as to what action should be taken upon said bridge.

On motion and vote it was Resolved that the Supt. of Highways be instructed to bar up the approach to the bridge pending action which the Board of Health may take and to charge expense of same to owner of the bridge.

On motion and vote it was decided to call a meeting of the Town Board of Health for Friday, July 2, 1926 at 2 P.M.

The following letter was read by the Town Clerk from the Lions Club of Riverhead:

Riverhead, New York.

To the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead:

Gentlemen :-

We respectfully request that your Board exercise the right conferred on you by law and appoint two night watchmen for your Town, the necessity for which is known to all its citizens.

On motion and vote it was Resolved that the matter of appointing night watchmen for the Town of Riverhead be laid on the table until the next meeting.

On motion and vote the following Fire Cracker Ordinance was duly adopted and the Clerk of the Board was instructed to have same published in the local papers and have the necessary numbers of posters distributed about the Town.

FIRE CRACKER ORDINANCE

Notice is hereby given that at a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York, the following ordinance was presented and adopted according to law:

"It shall be unlawful for any person to set off at any time any fire crackers whatever on the public highways in the Town of Riverhead, and it shall also be unlawful for any person or persons to build bonfires or set off any fireworks on the public highways in the said Town of Riverhead at any time. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable in a case of conviction by a fine not exceeding \$50 or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not exceeding six months or by both such fine and imprisonment."

The authority to pass this ordinance is found in Art. 2 of the Public Health Laws of the State of New York.

On motion and vote it was Resolved that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow upon promissory note the sum of Twenty Nine Hundred Seventy Nine and 37/100 Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of June 29th. 1926.

A letter was read from the State Historian advising that the Board had not appointed a Local Historian.

On motion and vote it was duly Resolved that Horace H. Williamson be re appointed Town Historian and that the Town Clerk notify the State Historian of such appointment.

Mr. Annold of the L.I. Lighting Company appeared before the Board relative to the Lighting District at Wading River presenting a map showing the manner in which they desired to properly light the district.

On motion and vote it was Resolved that the plan outlined by the Lighting Company be submitted to the Committee in the Lighting District and that action be deferred by the Town Board until the report of said committee be received.

There being no further business, meeting adjourned to meet at the Town Clerk's Office on Wednesday July 7th. at 2 P.M.
