

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office on September 16th. 1926 at 2 P.M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present. The minutes of the Meeting of September 2, were read and on motion adopted.

Mr. E. L. Brown of Jamesport addressed the Board regarding the dangerous condition of the sidewalks at Jamesport and requested that some action be taken to better this condition.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was Resolved that a sum of money be inserted in the Budget for permanently constructed sidewalks in section where same are needed.

Charles O. Downs requested that the sum of \$600.00 be transferred from the Miscellaneous Fund to the Machinery Fund.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized and directed to transfer the sum of \$600.00 from the Miscellaneous Fund to the Machinery Fund.

Charles O. Downs requested the sum of \$5000.00 to be placed in the Highway Account Item I.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was Resolved that the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow upon certified of indebtedness the sum of \$5000.00 and that said \$5000.00 be placed in Highway Account Item I.

Mr Danielson addressed the Board and requested that the Town place the extension of Ostrander Avenue from the L.I. Railroad Tracks to New Road in good condition, stating that this road had been accepted by the Town as a Highway 16 years ago.

The Town Clerk was directed to ascertain from the Town Records if the Town has a Title to the extension of Ostrander Avenue north of the tracks to New Road or Northville Turnpike.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was Resolved that the Town Clerk be directed to write the Board of Supervisors of Suffolk County calling their attention to the dangerous condition of the shoulders of the State Highways in Riverhead Town and requesting that men be placed on these roads to keep them in good condition.

A communication was received and placed on file from R. C. Brown requesting that some action be taken to widen the intersection of Fourth Street and East Avenue.

A legal opinion of James T. Walsh was read regarding the right of the Superintendent of Highways or Town Board to grant permission to run a railroad track over the Town Highway.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was Resolved that the Supervisor appoint a committee to ascertain what available beach property on Peconic Bay can be located suitable for a Town Park.

Supervisor Howell appointed Justices Corwin, Vail, Penny and Burnside a Committee on Public Park, Justice Corwin being designated as Chairman of this Committee.

The Town Clerk was instructed to write the Lions Club suggesting that they appoint a Committee to meet with the Town Public Park Committee for the purpose of locating a suitable spot for a Public Park on Peconic Bay.

The matter of a Special Constable to regulate traffic on Roanoke Avenue in front of the School was brought to the attention of the Board.

The opinion of the Board being that the expense of having an Officer on duty on Roanoke Avenue in front of the school should be borne by School District #5, the Town Clerk was instructed to write the Board of Education to this effect and also state that the Town Board would depudize whoever they desire for the position.

The committee regarding the land of the Town at Aquebogue was instructed to report at the next meeting of the Board.

The committee regarding the purchase of land of Harold Robinson and Gus Koskowski reported that the said Robinson and Koskowski refused to accept the \$300.00 each for said land.

The committee was instructed to continue.

On motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on September 29th. 1926 at 2 P.M.
