The minutes of the Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, of October 27th. 1926 were read and on motion approved.

Petitions were read by the Town Clerk for additional street lights, one between Main Street and First Street and the other at the intersection of Elton Avenue and Fishel Avenue.

Supervisor Howell appointed Justices Vail and Burnside to investigate conditions in these localities and report back to the Board as to whether additional street lights are required at these places.

Petitions were ordered placed on file.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the following appropriations were made for the tax levy for the years 1927 exclusive of the amount raised for Highway Purposes.
