

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Clerk's office, Wednesday July 29th, 1925 at 2-00 P.M.

Minutes of meeting of July 9th, 1925 read and on motion duly adopted.

Minutes of Special Meeting of July 17th, 1925 read and on motion duly adopted.

Messrs James O. Hagen, B. Frank Howell, Ralph C. Brown and Frederick Griffin appeared before the board and presented a petition signed by seventy five residents requesting that the parking regulations be amended to provide principally that automobiles be parked on Main Street and Peconic Avenue head in to the curb.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the petition was ordered placed on file.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the following resolution was duly adopted:

**PARKING REGULATIONS**  
TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, N. Y.

Resolutions of the town board of the town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, regulating the parking of automobiles and other vehicles. Adopted July 29, 1925.

It is hereby resolved that the resolution of this board adopted April 14, 1924, and the resolution of this board adopted July 9, 1925, regulating the parking of automobiles and other vehicles, be, and the same are hereby rescinded and repealed.

It is hereby resolved, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 552 of the laws of 1923, that the parking of automobiles and other vehicles on the highways in the town of Riverhead be restricted and regulated as follows:-

Regulation 1. No automobile or other vehicle shall be parked within ten feet of a fire hydrant.

Regulation 2. No automobile or other vehicle shall be parked within a space of ten feet from the center line of any street crossing designated by visible markings on the street and curb.

Regulation 3. No automobile or other vehicle shall be parked within any restricted area designated by signs or markings placed or posted by authority of the town board.

Regulation 4. Except as hereinafter provided, no automobile or other vehicle shall be parked on any street otherwise than with its right wheels within six inches of the curb or curb line.

Regulation 5. No automobile or other vehicle, except as hereinafter provided, shall be parked on Main Street between the Long Island House and East Avenue crossings, nor on Peconic Avenue, otherwise than with the right wheels touching the curb.

Regulation 6. No automobile or other vehicle shall be parked on the south side of Main Street, west of Griffin Avenue, otherwise than with both right wheels at least four feet clear of concrete road-bed.

Regulation 7. No motor truck or trailer, or automobile or other vehicle measuring more than fifteen feet over all, shall be parked on Main Street between the Long Island House and East Avenue crossings, nor on Peconic Avenue, unless backed to the curb and in the process of actual uninterrupted loading or unloading; but in no event shall any such vehicle defined by this regulation remain so parked for a period of more than one hour, between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon and midnight.

Regulation 8. No automobile or other vehicle shall make a left turn in leaving a parking space, but shall proceed to the nearest corner (Roanoke Avenue excepted) before turning around.

Regulation 9. No automobile or other vehicle shall turn around on Main Street at the Roanoke Avenue abutment.

Regulation 10. No automobile or other vehicle shall stop at the restricted space in front of the Post Office on Main Street for more than two minutes, which period is allowed for a business call at the office.

Regulation 11. All intersecting and abutting streets shall be marked at the center point of intersection or abutment, and all automobiles or other vehicles shall keep to the right of such marks in making turns at corners.

Regulation 12. No parking space shall be marked, nor shall any sign be displayed, restricting the parking of automobiles or other vehicles except upon authority of the Town Board.

Regulation 13. Any person parking or leaving a vehicle on the highways of the Town of Riverhead does so at his or her own risk.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized to borrow the sum of \$ 1800.00 upon promissory note to pay audited bills of July 28th, 1925.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Town Clerk notify the seller of the traffic signal on Peconic Avenue and Main Street that the same was not working properly and demanding that it immediately be repaired.


On motion duly made seconded and carried the Town Clerk was instructed to publish the parking regulations for two successive weeks in the County Review and Riverhead News.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the following resolution was duly adopted:-

RESOLVED, the the Supervisor and the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk, New York, or either of them be and they hereby are, authorized, empowered and directed to enter into a contract with the Automatic Registering Machine Co., Inc., for the purchase of three U.S. Standard Voting Machines of the 9 Row, 30 candidate size, at the net price of Nine Hundred Forty Dollars (\$940.00) each, f.o.b. Jamestown, N.Y. and be it further

RESOLVED, that, in payment of said voting machines, the Supervisor is hereby authorized empowered, and directed, upon receipt of said machines, to pay to the Automatic Registering Machine Co, Inc., the sum of Twenty eight hundred twenty dollars (\$2820.00).
