

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Clerk's office Saturday Nov. 14th. 1925 at 10-00 A.M.

Minutes of the meeting of November 9th, 1925 read and on motion duly adopted.

Mr. Ralph C. Brown informed the board that the historical society had contracted to sell and requested that steps be taken for the removal of the Soldiers Memorial Monument.

The Town Clerk read the request of the Lions Club for the establishing of a Police District.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that pursuant to Section 119 of the Town Law the boundaries of the unincorporated village of Riverhead, for the purpose set forth in said section, are hereby defined as follows:-

Beginning at a point in the highway known as Main Street, where it crosses the creek leading from Lanes Pond thence running due south to the centre of the Peconic River thence running westerly along the centre of the Peconic River and the same being the division line between the Town of Riverhead and the Town of Southampton, as it winds and turns, to a point in the centre of said river 740 feet westerly and at right angles from a continuation of the centre line of Raynor Avenue, thence running northerly and parallel with Raynor Avenue to a point 400 feet northerly from the north boundary line of the right of way of the Long Island Railroad, thence running easterly in a direct line and parallel with that section of Cemetery Avenue lying between Marcy Avenue and Roanoke Avenue to a point on the easterly side of Lane's Pond, thence running southerly along the east side of Lane's Pond to the centre of the creek leading therefrom, thence southeasterly along the centre of said creek to a point and the place of beginning, as shown on a map headed "Map of Proposed System of Water Supply for Riverhead, N.Y. Water District, May 1911 by W.E. Sexton and revised July 1912.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the Supervisor was authorized to employ counsel to have the judgement entered against the town by the State Insurance Fund cancelled.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to transfer the sum of \$ 500.00 from the Snow Fund to the Machinery Fund.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the bond of B. Frank Howell, Supervisor elect, be fixed and approved in the sum of \$ 50,000.00.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the following appropriations were made for the tax levy for the year 1926 and the supervisor was directed to present the same to the Board of Supervisors to be included in the tax warrant:-
